Please ensure your child has their own reusable utensils for their lunches and hot lunches


RESPECTING OUR SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT

THE PINK SHIRT DAY STORY

In 2007, Berwick, Nova Scotia, after a new student at their school was bullied for wearing a pink shirt, two grade 12 students bought 75 pink shirts and encouraged their classmates to wear pink. The next day they went to distribute the shirts and to their surprise the majority of students arrived wearing pink! With that act of kindness, Pink Shirt Day was born. In 2008, British Columbia proclaimed every last Wednesday of February to be the provincial anti-bullying day, and the movement has continued to grow.

Our district and school goal is centered around building a sense of belonging amongst our community. We are connecting our learning about inclusion, friendship, kindness and how to be a "principled" Cypress Park student. As primary school teachers, we recognize that our children are still developing the skills to navigate complex social situations. Cypress Park will celebrate Pink Shirt Day on February 26th!



EXPLORING WINTER AS INQUIRER

Our outdoor classroom looked very different today! As Inquirers, we explored the snow, noticing how our environment has changed. The children asked questions about how the snow feels, what happens when it melts, and how it affects the plants and animals around us. Through play and discovery, we are deepening our understanding of seasonal changes while having so much fun outdoors!
































Grade One has been working on these larger

In honour of Valentine's Day, Grade Two's experimented with pipe cleaner hearts, Borax, and hot water. Students were **PRINCIPLED THINKERS** during experiment. They made hearts out of pipe cleaners and pencils, and then we submerged in them into the Borax / hot water solution. We had to use all the materials safely and then make predictions about what we thought was going to happen. We then made observations over two days. Ask your child what happened!
