IB STUDENT LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS



MOTHER LANGUAGE DAY

On February 21st, we celebrated International Mother Language Day, an occasion to honor and embrace the diversity of languages spoken within our school community. This day, recognized globally, highlights the importance of preserving and promoting linguistic and cultural diversity.

Students we invited to bring in books written in their native languages to share with their classmates. It was a heartwarming display of the various languages that enrich our school environment and provided a platform for others to learn about the languages and customs of their peers.



CVC WORD HUNT!

KINDERGARTEN students were thinkers as they walked around the room, searching for CVC (consonant-vowel-consonant) words! They used their letter sound knowledge to find and record words, focusing on beginning, middle, or ending sounds—or even the whole word. As an extension, some students challenged themselves by using their CVC words to create short sentences.

It was a great way to build confidence in sounding out words and practicing early writing skills.



LIGHT AND SOUND

In GRADE ONE we have been connecting light and sound to stories. This week we read the Girl and the Wolf and used shadows and puppets to tell the story. Ms King, our district Indigenous support teacher, came to visit and we thought about the importance of oral storytelling.

Next week we hope to create our own class story and tell it using light and sound effects. Stay tuned...

We have also been thinking about the concept of FORM as we explore shapes. Here we are using our social skills, working in groups to sort a variety of shapes according to attributes (what is it like, properties of shapes).
