EARLY PICKUPS & SIGN-OUT PROCEDURES

If your child needs to leave school before our regular dismissal time of 2:30 PM, please email both the classroom teacher and the office first thing in the morning. Advance notice allows teachers to plan ahead and minimize classroom disruption. Unscheduled pickups can interrupt lessons, and in some cases, students may need help gathering materials or packing up, requiring teacher support which takes attention away from the rest of the class.

TAKE A PEEK EVERY WEEK

IB STUDENT LEARNING HIGHLIGHTS



IN GRADE ONE...

Grade one spent time this week inquiring about patterns and wondering what patterns live in our forest and playground. We sketched the patterns we found and shared them with classmates. In connection to our inquiry into relationships we began thinking about how to solve problems in relationships and ways conflict can lead to cooperation. We have taken home research to find out more. We read this great book on how to apologize.

In connection, they were introduced to the zones of regulation. This is an effective tool to name and regulate our emotions. They discussed that building strong relationships starts with making good choices. Mrs. AndersonI call these green choices, as they keep themselves and others in the green zone.



GRADE TWO - WHO WE ARE

Grade two is nearing the end of their Inquiry Unit on feelings, actions and relationships. They inquired into what a relationship is and how they might have one with. They also discussed how our feelings can affect our actions which can effect our relationships.

In working on our social and communication skills the students will be planning some activities for Halloween in our class. They are learning how to be a more effective team member and how to respond when someone has a different idea than them. This week they looked through Halloween stories and searched for evidence on how others' celebrate Halloween. In doing so they also used their research skills.

As students and families start to think about costumes, to ensure the day is fun for everyone, please observe the following dos and don'ts:

- Feel welcome to dress in a costume or not.
- Continue to avoid costumes that promote cultural stereotypes. If you're looking for information on cultural appropriation vs. cultural appreciation, click HERE for a CBC video; and for a great list of questions to ask about whether a costume is appropriate or not, click HERE to see information from UBC's Equity & Inclusion Office.
- NO MASKS, beyond, of course, medical masks worn for health reasons.
- Absolutely NO WEAPONS (swords, lightsabers, nunchucks etc.) and please make sure costumes are school appropriate.
- Wear something comfortable that can be worn all day and can withstand being outside in any weather.
- Students should be able to put on their costume and take it off to use the bathroom by themselves.
- Avoid scented items that might irritate others (e.g. some hair colouring products).
- Come to school in your costume; there will be no changing in the washrooms.
- Students who wish to bring in Halloween candy to school are asked to limit it to two pieces. (remember no nuts)
