Trustee's Report - Sheelah Donahue Vice Chair West Vancouver School Board

- Chair Broady was elected President of the British Columbia School Trustees Association (BCSTA) at our recent AGM. Prior to the AGM, Vice Chair Donahue was elected to the provincial Professional Learning Committee (PLC) as the Metro rep, and Trustee Brown is now the acting chair of BCSTA Metro Branch. West Vancouver is well represented both provincially and in the Metro region.
- BCSTA AGM and Provincial Update www.bcsta.org
 - BCSTA work is wide-ranging and aside from perennial topics like funding, several issues will be prominent in the upcoming term: local board governance, addressing learning loss, COVID recovery, and continued emphasis on our legal and moral obligations around indigenous education. Provincial work in this area is led by the First Nations Education Steering Committee (FNESC) www.fnesc.ca with whom an historic agreement and action plan were created to affirm our mutual commitment to enhancing student achievement across the province
 - BCSTA AGM is also the place for motion debate and approval. Some motions of interest:
 - 1. BCSTA COVID Working Group (around extraordinary costs)
 - 7. Universal Food Program
 - 10. Climate Action (around BC Hydro caps)
 - 11. Safe Passing Distance for Safer Routes to School
 - 12. Funding for Outdoor Learning Spaces
- Indigenous Education and Relationships
 - In addition to the provincial work, we continue to work locally on both cultural and
 political relationships, and student achievement. This work is led by District
 Principals Ian Kennedy and Liz Hill in conjunction with our West Vancouver
 Indigenous Ed Committee (WVIEC). Vice Chair Donahue is the board liaison to this
 committee.
 - Sempulyan has replaced Chris Lewis as our Squamish Nation political liaison to the committee

- Budget and Finance
 - We continue to be the second least funded district in the province so it is a testament to our leadership team, staff, and parents that we continue to achieve what we do here in West Vancouver
 - Audit committee meets in May and KPMG is our external auditor
 - Budget consultation is complete and we are looking for approval in June
 - The wild card is the new Employment standards legislation around paid sick leave for teachers on call and other applicable categories of staff
- Liaison Meetings: Mayor and Council are strong supporters of our work in areas that overlap, for example, School Traffic Advisory Round Table (START), youth support initiatives, and the West Vancouver Place for Sport.
- School Traffic Advisory Round Table (START)
 - Engagement with START and trustees has increased due to a renewed interest in active modes of transportation and urban planning issues
 - This work is supported in many ways by municipal staff
 - Next meeting May 11th, Jatinder Sidhu is the DPAC rep to this group
 - FYI Bike to School Week May 30
 - Video contest
- Trustees are carefully starting to visit schools and we look forward to getting back to more personal connections where appropriate in the coming months

Superintendent's Report – Chris Kennedy (PPT presentation distributed with minutes)

- West Vancouver Place for Sport
 - o Project Manager is identified, scope of project is being finalized.
 - Timelines are yet to be finalized.
- Indigenous course requirement
 - Waiting on the provincial confirmation if there is any change in the requirement
 - All Grade 10/11 students are required to take it; likely will be completed through Language Arts
- Enrollment Update (Local and International)
 - Local enrollment is even as compared to last year.
 - International enrollment projection is down as compared to previous years.
- French Immersion Review
 - o Review to happen in May with implementation in fall of 2023
- Spring Events
 - Bridge Festival Community Day on June 3-4 where WV Schools are participating
 - Graduation Events
 - Elementary Track & Field will happen on June 9th at Swangard Stadium in Burnaby.

Guest Speakers- 10:04 am

DPAC is happy to welcome Julia Leiterman, Secretary Treasurer & CFO of West Vancouver Schools, who will provide a high-level summary of the factors that determine funding, and the process by which it is allocated within the budget. Topics will include funding & strategic planning, the budget cycle, and the role of Trustees, stakeholders, schools, facilities and PACs in the budget process.

Presentation slides will be shared along with the meeting minutes.

Q&A with Julia Leiterman:

- Q:Nessa Van Bergen Elementary school hours are limited to 6 hours and lunch break is not enough for the students. Who makes the decision and can negotiate with the teacher union to increase work hours (maybe 6.5hr) and how does it affect the district budget?
 - A: Julia & Chris: Increasing the length of education day will impact the budget and it is highly unlikely that the teacher workday will be extended more than what they already have.
- **Q**: Kyra: For Lunch Supervision, can parents volunteer to help?
 - o **A**: Chris: There are liability concerns, and it is not possible at the moment.
- **Q**: Jatinder: Has a school ever closed given the traffic situation/school capacity?
 - A: Julia & Chris: WVS are only closed if the local enrollment drops below budget which doesn't happen that often. Current WVSD capacity is 7400 which includes 400 international and 1500 outside of the district enrollment.
- Q: Nora Gambioli: What is the ideal mix of local vs international students?
 - A: Julia: International enrollment is much more profitable than the local enrollment given how challenging it is for the young families to settle in WV; this funding supports many of the programs WVS offers. With WV demographics changing, out of district enrollment is important to keep our schools full / fully funded.
- Q: Kelly Kerklaan: Are PACs or parents able to see their school's budget somewhere?
 - A: Julia: School administrators are owners of their budget and are not shared with the district. School principals can provide the information if required.
- Q: Marisa Yang: If international student enrollments continue to go down will it impact the current budgets?
 - A: Julia: Not all the expenses will be impacted but there are some that might be, for ex. Daytime custodians, elementary bands. There is no straight forward answer to the question but a topic of discussion and assessing what expenses will be impacted if the budget goes down.
