Students explore career-related content and submit their work in their portfolios.




Students explore, register and attend various post-secondary presentations and fairs.




Students can reach out to their Careers' teachers at anytime.



Students and Parents/Guardians can book meetings to discuss their personalized post-secondary plans.






West Vancouver School District University Conversion Statistics

- 48.7% of BC high school students transition to postsecondary education with in one year after graduation
- 85% of West Vancouver district students transition within one year
- Less than 5% of BC students go out of province to do university/college studies
- half of our students leave the province to study. This includes approximately 8-10% of our students leaving Canada



UBC computer science - apply to Science and after first year apply to a computer science major. Engineering, general first year or directly into specialization

• Degree requirements

Read through course descriptions and requirements

• Size

Acadia (3,000) vs UofT (97,000), smaller programs within larger programs (Science One, Land One at UBC), smaller institutions within larger institutions (Huron University College @ Western)

• Direct Entry vs. Transfer Program

Langara, Douglas College, Capilano University to UBC/SFU/UVIC

• UK/Ireland/Australia offer 3 year bachelor degrees, 4 year integrated masters, direct entry to professional programs

Medicine, Dentistry, Law, Vet Med. etc.

Location

- Distance from home, family and loved ones
- Urban, Suburban or Rural communities
- Housing, type and availability of residence/off campus housing

Academics

• Program course requirements, Engineering vs Arts (4-6 grade 12 courses)

In Canada GPA is typically calculated on 4-6 grade 12 academic marks if available. If those marks are not available they will use grade 11 marks

- Grade 11 course requirements in BC, 2nd language requirements
- **GPA minimums** (Arts McGill 92.5% vs UAlberta 80%)
- Holistic vs. marked-based admission

Most selective US universities are holistic and looking at grade 9-12 marks. Many Canadian universities only looking at grade 12 GPA. Some professional programs in Canada are more holistic. UK are only looking at predicted grade 12 marks, personal statement and one reference, with some programs requiring testing.

- Retention Rates after 1st year (Queen's 94.1%, UBC 92%, UofT 93%)

University Application Timeline

Most institutions open applications October 1st. Application deadline for some UK direct entry programs is Oct. 15 UBC's early deadline is Dec.01. Many students will be applying to programs starting in December. Students will continue applying to Canadian universities and Colleges and will be sending grades. Some students who applied early will start receiving offers in Feb.
