Running Effective Meetings

Effective meetings are structured, respectful, and purposeful. They run on clear agendas, encourage broad participation, and result in decisions that are well-documented and shared.

- Create an Agenda
- Use simplified Robert's Rules:
 Motion → Second → Discussion → Vote
- Managing conflict and tricky conversations respectfully
- Encourage broad parent participation
- Document decisions clearly & share minutes promptly

Focus on quality over quantity — it's okay to do fewer things well.

Shifting from "we need help" to "we have opportunities"

Matching parents to roles that suit their skills and time

Avoiding burnout — micro-volunteering & event-based helpers

Appreciate volunteers often — recognition keeps people coming back.
