- WVSD had 2 dedicated physical literacy personnel on staff, Amber Pascual and Erin Crawford. PAC propose the March meeting on 11th will be an evening meeting from 6pm to 7:30pm and include a workshop for Parent Education on Physical Literacy and Nutrition presented by Amber and Erin.

Traffic and Safety

- Application required for the mini school grant. Would ideally work on a pedestrian crossing at marine drive and Keith Road as many families use the corner of the field to walk to and from school.
- NSSC meeting held in December was highly focussed on Physical Literacy and healthy eating. A presentation was given by Dr. Ceinwen Pope, Medical Health Officer for the North Shore on Child and Youth Health and Wellbeing. Main take away was that the North Shore and Coast Garibaldi continue to participate in more physical activity and tend to have healthier eating patterns than the rest of BC, however trends from 2018 to now are downward and showing we need to refocus on physical activity and health eating.
