

Parent/Guardian General Information/Disclosure & Informed Consent Form Ski & Snowboard Field Trip

PURPOSE:

To provide the opportunity for students in Grade 6/7 to develop knowledge and skills by participating actively, effectively, safely and responsibly in an individual snow-based sport.

EVENTS:

Friday, January 19, 2024 Cypress Mountain Friday, February 2, 2024 Cypress Mountain

TRANSPORTATION:

Transportation to local mountain (Cypress) will be by bus.

LEVEL OF SUPERVISION:

All supervisors will remain on the mountain or at the base of the mountain. The head supervisor will be linked to mountain operations via a cellular phone. Supervisors will be skiing/snowboarding in small separate groups, and cellular phones will link these groups. All supervisors will have the following:

A list of the participants
Participant emergency contact information
Participant medical information. Student Emergency Procedure Plans/medical supplies will be
brought for students with life-threatening medical conditions (e.g., anaphylaxis).
Cellular phone numbers of the other supervisors

Participants will be under direct supervision while in transit but not necessarily over course of the entire day. Skiers are required to ski/board with a "buddy" and check-in at lunchtime.

SPONSORS:

Adult to student supervision ratios will be in the range of 1:10 to 1:15. Due to unforeseen circumstances supervisors may need to be substituted.

RISK ASSESSMENT:

Skiing and snowboarding are inherently dangerous activities, and it is impossible for the coaches to always supervise all participants on the mountain. Risks have been minimized by requiring skiers to ski/board with a "buddy" and by discussing with the skiers, the risk, and the responsibilities inherent in skiing and snowboarding. Skiers have demonstrated their awareness of risk and responsibility by completing the Student Awareness of Risk and Responsibility Form.

SAFETY RULES/REGULATIONS:

All school rules and the school Code of Conduct are in effect (see school website for more information). Students are <u>not</u> permitted access to the terrain parks unless specifically indicated on this form. Helmet use is mandatory for all school-sponsored ski/snowboard programs. Students must stay on the same mountain as listed above and that includes training or racing. All students must follow the Alpine Responsibility Code listed attached.

FIRST AID PROVISIONS:



A first aid kit will be kept on each bus for access while in transit. Student Emergency Procedure Plans/medical supplies will be brought for students with life-threatening medical conditions (e.g., anaphylaxis). While on the mountain, the Ski Patrol will provide first aid. To access any required first aid while on the mountain students should speak to employees of the mountain who may be identified by their uniforms. A field trip supervisor is to be contacted if any student requires first aid.

ITINERARY: (Arrival and departure times are the same on all days):

8:10 am Participating students begin boarding bus (parked on Inglewood Ave.)

8:45 am Arrive at Cypress Mountain downhill area

9:00 am Session begins

12:00 pm Students check-in with supervisors at a designated location on the mountain

LUNCH

12:45 pm Free skiing/boarding 2:00 pm Bus leaves ski mountain

2:45 pm Approximate arrival time at Ecole Cedardale

Note: Students will be ability grouped for lessons once at Cypress. Rental equipment will also be fitted at this time.

WHAT TO BRING:

Lunch / snacks

Water bottle

Warm, dry winter clothing (no cotton), toque, gloves or mitts, goggles, sunscreen, neck warmer water/windproof jacket & pants, warm socks, and appropriate footwear.

A change of clothes (optional)

Optional: Shoes in backpack

Helmet

Layers of wicking garments (fleece or wool combinations offer the best warmth)

PARENT/GUARDIAN RESPONSIBILITY:

Parents/guardians have the responsibility to arrange for their child's own accident or liability insurance.

Parents/guardians have the responsibility to determine whether the student may participate on the ski/board trip demonstrated by the completion and signing of an Informed Consent Form (below)

Alpine Responsibility Code

There are elements of risk that common sense and personal awareness can help to reduce. Regardless of how you decide to use the slopes, always show courtesy to others. Please adhere to the code listed below and share with others the responsibility for a safe outdoor experience.

- Always stay in control. You must be able to stop, or to avoid other people or objects.
- People ahead of you have the right-of-way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- Do not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
- Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.
- Always use proper devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- Observe and obey all posted signs and warnings.
- Keep off closed trails and closed areas.
- You must not use lifts or terrain if your ability is impaired through use of alcohol or drugs.
- You must have sufficient physical dexterity, ability and knowledge to safely load, ride and unload lifts. If in doubt, ask the lift attendant.
