# **Illness Guidelines**

This is a reminder to please keep your child at home if they are sick. We appreciate this is a more blurry line than in the past, so here are some details to help:

- If children require medication, especially for a fever, they are not well and should stay home. Heavy congestion, fever, a runny nose that is not clear, nausea, heavily fatigued, a newer cough = stay home
- Clear runny nose, a persistent cough after being to the doctor to determine non-contagion = come
