Take a Hike Foundation and West Vancouver Schools Information Session

Starting in the 2023/24 school year, the West Vancouver School District will be partnering with the Take a Hike Foundation to offer a more comprehensive program to Inglewood Secondary for students in grades 10 -12. Take a Hike layers additional supports on top of existing school resources to provide students with a full-time alternative education program. Through group therapy sessions and land-based learning activities, clinical therapists and educators work collaboratively to help students process emotions, build resilience and self-awareness, and learn to use physical activity and mindfulness practices to improve well-being. Take a Hike currently works with school districts on Vancouver Island, the Lower Mainland and the Interior. We are excited to partner with Take a Hike to help support the students and families of West Vancouver Schools.

We will be offering an information session on May 9th at 3:30pm for interested community members who would like to learn more about the Take a Hike program. Pete Prediger, Director of Programs & Clinical Director and Alaine Anicete, Program Manager will be sharing a short presentation and answer any questions about the program and partnership with West Vancouver Schools.

School District #45 is participating in the 2023 Ministry of Education Electronic Anonymous Student Learning Survey Project in cooperation with all other school districts throughout the Province.

Parents/Guardians/Caregivers can complete the online Anonymous Student Learning Surveys any time before 11:59 pm **April 29th, 2023**, providing immediate results to the school and the district.

- 1. Students in Grades 4 and 7 will complete the survey at school.
- 2. All Staff associated with a school complete the survey.
- 3. Parents/Guardians/Caregivers of Grade 4 and 7 students are invited to complete the survey
- 1. Any other family members wishing to participate with students in other grade levels are welcome to do so.

To complete the survey:

- 1. Go to any computer that has an up-to-date internet browser access.
- 1. Go to www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey/access.htm
- 1. Under the section Direct Access no logon number required select:
- 1. **District:** the name of your child's district (45)
- 2. **School:** the name of your child's school (Ecole Pauline Johnson Elementary)
- 3. Language: the language of your choice
- 1. Complete the survey by clicking on the appropriate circle to answer each question. Move to the next set of questions by clicking on the right arrow in the bottom right corner of the screen.
- 2. Click on the left arrow to navigate backwards.

- 4. When you are finished the survey, you will get a message "Thank you for sharing your views".
- 5. Once complete, your school will have the results immediately.

The e-survey site will be open until April 29th.
