VANCOUVER COASTAL HEALTH INFORMATION

1. Twenty-three percent (23% or 460,000) of youth aged 15 to 19 in Canada have tried vapour products and nearly 3 out of 5 high school smokers also use vapor products – some studies show that non-smoking youth who use e-cigarettes are more likely to try conventional cigarettes.

2. Until about age 25, the brain is still growing. Each time a new memory is created or a new skill is learned, stronger connections or synapses are built between brain cells. Young people's brains build synapses faster than adult brains. Because addiction is a form of learning, adolescents can get addicted more easily than adults. The brain exposed to nicotine in vapor products can lead to addiction. "It's okay, they are nicotine free" initially when it was illegal for vapour products to contain nicotine in Canada there was a market for nicotine-free products. Even then, studies found that many which were labelled nicotine free still contained nicotine. Now most products on the market contain nicotine.

3. Nicotine can harm parts of the brain that control attention, learning, memory, concentrations mood, and impulse control

4. The chemicals, dyes, flavourings and nicotine in the aerosols of vapor products are potentially harmful when heated and turned into aerosols and then inhaled. They can increase cough, wheeze and asthma exacerbations.
