VANCOUVER COASTAL HEALTH INFORMATION

Back to school time is exciting but it can also be stressful for parents and children. Proper sleep and good nutrition can boost teens' coping skills and performance. According to Canadian statistics almost 40% of Canadian school-aged kids are sleep-deprived because they are too busy. Canada is the third most sleep-deprived country, with nearly a third of the Canadians feeling like they don't sleep enough, according to a new study.

Children who consistently get a good night's sleep:

Are more creative, can concentrate on tasks for longer, are better able to make positive decisions, learn and remember new things, have more energy during the day and can create and maintain good relations with others. More info: https://sleep.org/

According to the new Canadian 24-Hour Movement Guidelines, the world's first evidence based guidelines to address the whole day: for optimal health benefits, children and youth (aged 5–17 years) should achieve high levels of physical activity, low levels of sedentary behaviour, and sufficient sleep (8-10 hours for youth aged 14-17). Trading indoor time for outdoor time, and replacing sedentary behaviours and light physical activity with additional moderate to vigorous physical activity can provide greater health benefits. ACTIVITY FEES

Activity Fees are necessary to provide a range of goods and services to students. Please note: West Vancouver School District Policy #9505 allows: "that fees or partial fees may be waived for students who would not otherwise be able to participate in regular school activities, field studies and special events due to financial hardship".

TRAFFIC AT SENTINEL SECONDARY

TRAFFIC FLOW NOTICEABLY SLOWS WHEN CARS DROP STUDENTS ANYWHERE IN FRONT OF THE SCHOOL OR IN THE UPPER LOT. PLEASE OBSERVE THE DROP OFF ZONES:)

The Administration is aware of the ongoing traffic problem entering and leaving the school grounds. Mornings between 8:00 and 8:25 am are of particular concern.

The student drop-off area extends from just past the school and around the east side of the school. Please do not drop students off in the upper parking lot. This is for two reasons. Student safety and traffic flow. Students have to cross a lane of moving traffic that must come to a halt while students are dropped off and then the traffic flow stops again while students cross the flow on the cross walk below. Please only drop students off along the front or sides of the school. We ask that when you drive along the front of the school, please move forward until you can't move forward anymore, even if it means moving past the school. Once you are stopped or you reach the crosswalk by the driveway, students can quickly and safely exit the vehicle without crossing moving traffic. If your child is unable to quickly exit the vehicle for example their bag is in the trunk or you need to speak with them, please continue to drive to the east side of the school and find a spot to pull over. Please do not stop directly in front of the school or on the crosswalk. When cars stop for an extended time in front of the school, they stop the traffic flow. Your assistance in complying with this request is appreciated.

Please, when entering off Chartwell Drive, <u>do not drive down the left side of the road</u> to drop off your child or take a short-cut to the parking lot. You run the risk of colliding with oncoming traffic. This left lane is a one-way street with a crosswalk to the east of it. Left Drivers should be aware that "vehicles entering against the flow of traffic would be violating S.125 of the Motor Vehicle Act Fail to Obey a Traffic Control Device. The fine is \$121 and 2 points on their license" (West Vancouver Police Department).

PLEASE observe the Handicap Parking Zone (HCP). We have several students requiring access to this HCP parking/pick-up area in vans – your assistance in this regard is appreciated.

SCHOOL MESSENGER

The School Messenger will primarily be used to let parents know if their child is absent from class. When the teacher marks the student absent without a prior phone call, he/she will be marked unexcused in the computer and School Messenger will call or email the parents.

RADON SCREENING

This past winter West Vancouver Schools worked in partnership with Vancouver Coastal Health, to screen for radon in all of our schools. This school screening initiative was undertaken to confirm that radon concentrations are low in district schools. For more information please click here
