2. Grade 12 Graduation Literacy Assessment: January 23 - 26

All Grade 12 Sentinel students will be writing the Grade 12 Literacy Assessment this school year - this assessment is required for graduation. Your first opportunity to complete this assessment is January 23rd - 27th, 2023. All Grade 12 students will be registered to complete the

assessment during this period, and we recommend you complete it in January. The Ministry of Education allows students three opportunities to complete the assessment if desired.

Students should prepare for this exam. Sample exams, videos and more information can be found here: https://curriculum.gov.bc.ca/provincial/grade-12-literacy-assessment. All Grade 12 students should try the sample exams (printed or online) and review the scoring guide. Developing a familiarity with the types of exam questions and computer interface will support students to be successful in this exam.
