## 5. <u>Indigenous Experience Presented to WV PAC</u>

The Blanket Exercise uses Indigenous ways of teaching and knowledge to build an understanding of our shared history by walking participants through pre-contact, treaty-making, and colonization from the Indigenous perspective. It is a participatory history lesson designed by Indigenous elders to foster truth and understanding. Although the experience and content covered are emotionally challenging, the blanket exercise provides us with an opportunity to move forward with Truth and Reconciliation.

We are very fortunate to have all three sessions facilitated by amazing Indigenous Educational Leaders - Stephanie Maki (Coquitlam District Principal of Indigenous Education) and Brad Baker (Associate Superintendent of Indigenous Education, Ministry of Education and Child Care).

Due to the nature of the activity, space is limited to 50 participants at each FOS Blanket Exercise. They have assigned schools with an equitable allotment of seats. Sentinel has 13 spots for parents and the date of the blanket exercise is on Wednesday, April 5, 6:00-8:00 pm at Sentinel. PLEASE BRING A BLANKET.
