Ministry of Education 2023 Student Learning Survey -Gr 10 & 12 Parents, **The Student Learning Survey 2023** is to be completed by April 29th. The Provincial Student Learning Survey gathers information on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective. It will be administered to students in grades 10 and 12, their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. The surveys contain standard questions for the province. It is simple, secure, and can be accessed by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. Please scroll the to "Parent" section, and the "Direct Access" area. From the drop-down menu, select "school district 45" and "Sentinel Secondary". Thank you for your time in completing this survey!

Dear parents/guardians, the next Sentinel immunization clinic will be on May 17. Vaccines are given over several doses, as a series, to stimulate an effective immune response and protect against disease. School immunization consent is valid for the series up to a period of 2 years. If we have an active consent form for your child, we will complete the vaccine doses your child is due for.

Please contact us prior to the day of clinic if:

- A. Your child has received any vaccinations outside of school, Public Health, or COVID/Flu Clinics since you provided consent for example, at your family doctor's office or a travel clinic.
- B. You no longer consent to your child to receiving vaccines at school this year.
- C. You have questions
