# **Updates / Reports:**

- 4. 2024-25 Draft Budget Belinda Jia
  - Financials: 2023-24 Actual and 2024-25 draft budget circulated.
  - 2024-25 Draft Budget Highlights:
    - Changed from cash-based (2023-24) to accrual accounting (2024-25) principles, so to better reflect on real financial position of PAC.
    - Income: Gaming grant is set; other income is a projection, not actual. This is based on what we set for fundraising and how we do.
    - o **Expenses:** In 3 categories:
      - Parent connection & PAC admin
      - Staff Appreciation Events
      - Student Support Programs
    - o For Discussion:
      - Reserve of GIC \$63000. This is an amount accumulated over years. PAC can consider spending a portion of it on projects that PAC believes are worthwhile.
      - Reserve of \$8000 from Gaming Grant. Can consider using for 2024-25 year.
    - o Final budget is due to pass in November 2024 meeting.
- 5. Events Anna Chin

Key Events planned for 2024-25:

- Used book sales to collect now and due to run the sale in November.
- Holiday decorating a tradition <u>for parents to help students</u> decorate for Christmas, Lunar New Year and Persian New Year
- Staff Appreciation Winter Holiday Lunch, Valentine's Baked Goods,
  Year-End Lunch (parents contribution and volunteer)
- Multi-Cultural Lunch March 6! Parents of different cultural backgrounds host tables to sell food and treats. Calling for coordinators.
- 6. Wish-List Dana Renaud
  - We gather wishes/needs from teachers, clubs, sports teams that need funding or money. The WishList Team sorts through these applications by category and reviews with Principal Finch to decide how these needs can be met (Gaming Grant, current school budget, etc...). It is assessed based on the motto for the year and how it will benefit the students body. Intakes for Wishlist are gathered in Oct & Jan. We have budgeted \$24000

- + and also have \$8000 from previous years for the Wishlist budget this year.
- 7. Parent Education Empowering Parents, Enriching Futures Diane Shoar
  - 2023-24: ParentEd held 5 online events and a traffic initiative campaign in May 2024.
  - 2024-25:
    - Traffic Initiative Campaign (Sep 3-13, and May 2025): encourage use of alternative transportation (scooter, e-bikes) and alternative drop-off location (outside school premises) to parents. Safety Bliz in collaboration with WVPD & Bylaw (Collab Day on Sep 26).
      - Feedback: Map was very helpful to Grade 8 parents.
    - o Parent Education Workshops
      - Cell Phone in Schools (Virtual Presentation Sep 17-7pm): this is arranged in response to the province-wide school policy on personal device usage. Cari Wilson (VP of Technology and Innovation at WVSD) is the speaker, and the session is moderated by Mike Finch. Posters are circulated in Parent Whatsapp groups and eBulletin these two weeks.
      - Mentoring for Boys, Dads, and Mom: in collaboration with Boys Club Network.

- 8. Legacy Team Sam Ridgway

- This is a team that focuses on fundraising for special, long-term projects that are important to Sentinel community
- 2023-24: Priority Student social spaces. Easing pressure cafeteria to other areas of school. Through Parent Socials, the team raised CAD17000. First phase of indoor social spaces will be done by Christmas 2024.
- 2024-25: Goal is to raise CAD40000 to complete indoor social spaces,
  with an eye for some bigger projects (gym floor).
  - Parent socials: community building and fundraising (ticket sales & donation)

- 9. Grad Team Gem Chu
  - Semi-Formal in October (Shipyards).
  - Grade 12 Post-Secondary Info Session.
- 10. School Team Principal Mike Finch
  - Introducing: Vice Principal Crystal Tanfara (previously VP of WVSS, DVP of International Programs of WVSD). She is also a grade 8 parent!
  - Administrators by Grade:
    - Shawn Anderson Grade 8 & 10.
    - Crystal is responsible for Grade 9 & 11.
    - Mike Finch Grade 12.
  - Unlike elementary schools where PAC drives many initiatives on behalf of students, here initiatives are mostly student-led where PAC and administrators are to support. PAC is a solution-oriented place to support students by working in collaboration with the administrators.
  - Updates:
    - Renovations over the summer:
      - Portables are painted.
      - Boilers are upgrade.
      - One of girls' washroom is upgraded (one more left this summer).

- Lockers are removed, and students are involved to decide how the spaces will be used as social spaces with plans confirmed by Dec 2024.
- o Sentinel Community is involved in Summer Olympics 2024:
  - Nick Zhang Fencing
  - Alison Carruthers (School Accountant)'s niece Julie
    Bosteau Swimming.
- In 2023-24: Of the 244 Grade 12 students, 241 graduated in June. 98% are pursuing post-secondary schools. A grade 12 student / Sentinel alumni (Ryan Sabat) died a tragic accident in the summer, and a scholarship is WV Community Foundation is created in his name. Any support from the Sentinel Community to their family and the scholarship is appreciated - through the WV Community Foundation.

### o 2024-25:

- Class Placements: With 1200 students and staff in place, counsellors work hard to the requests and land them in classes. Due to space and class limitations, priority to requests goes to grade 12 for their graduation and post-secondary, and then grade 11 onwards.
- Sentinel is a busy place especially September. Keep an eye on the eBulletin and encourage your kids to be involved!
- On Grads: there are 220+ Grade 12 students: there is a whole host of Grad events that we support (Winter Carnival, Semi Formal, Banquet, Social Events) but there are student-initiative and run events (that are not supported by school, i.e. no staff supervision) e.g. Big White in Kelowna, Car Rally, Grad Kidnap, Sleep Out, etc... Decision to participate is a conversation that should be had between parents and students.
- Cell phones and device policy: "when the teacher asks you to put away, you put away. When the teacher asks you to bring it out for educational purposes, bring it out". early indication is kids are coping well.
- On PAC's involvement: PAC typically raises funds to support enhancement and extra-curricular activities outside (capital funding), scholarships. While school

boards have been protective about PAC's involvement in capital projects in the past, School Board is now open for PAC engagement to support large initiatives like gym floor installation (approx CAD250,000 - CAD300,000). As school and PAC, if we can reduce School Board financial burden significantly, to, perhaps CAD200,000, we could make this happen, potentially as soon as Summer 2025!

 Another potential initiative is to upgrade electronic devices in our computer labs, which costs CAD60000 in total. An upgrade to the Media Lab was done over the summer.
