What do I do if my son or daughter is absent/dismissed early from School?

If your child is going to be absent from school for the entire day; miss any classes; arrive late or leave early please let us know via a parent email at **sentinelattendance@wvschools.ca**. If this is not possible, please call: 604-981-1130. All attendance related notices must be received by our office staff by 2pm on the day of the absence. If a child's absence remains "unexcused", you will receive an automated call/email on the evening of the absence.

How should I deal with any concerns that I have with my child in a class?

All schools in West Vancouver deal with teacher / student concerns using a three-step approach. Step 1 is for the student to discuss their concern with their teacher. If this fails or the student is not inclined to speak with their teacher, step 2 is for the parent, student, and teacher to discuss the issue. If this does not bring resolution the final step 3 is for the parent to bring the issue to the administrator for that grade level

This process makes sense as it is the teacher, who best knows your child in class. Parents often remark that when they discuss an issue with the teacher, they learn something unexpected or worthwhile about their child.
