Pathway to Graduation BC Dogwood Diploma

- Graduation requirements are listed on page 16 of our <u>Sentinel Course Planning Handbook 2025-26</u>
- Graduation requirements differ from university requirements
- Students need a minimum of **80 credits** to graduate
- A minimum of 16 credits must be at the grade 12 level
- 4 credits required from an Indigenous-focused course(s)
- 52 of the 80 credits are earned by completing the following 13 required courses:

GRADUATION

Required courses: 52 credits of 80

- 1. Career Life Education (CLE) 10 (4 credits)
- 2. Career Life Connections (2 credits each)
 - a. CLC 12A (grade 11)
 - b. CLC 12B (grade 12)
- 3. Physical and Health Education (PE) 10 (4 credits)
- 4. Science 10 & 11 (minimum 2) (8 credits)
- 5. Social Studies 10 & 11 **or** 12 (minimum 2) (8 credits)
- 6. Math 10 & 11 (minimum 2) (8 credits)
- 7. English 10, 11 & 12 (all 3) (12 credits)
- 8. Arts Education or Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies 10, 11, **or** 12 (4 credits)

Pathway to Graduation

Numeracy + Literacy Assessments

In addition, students must also complete the three new graduation Assessments:

- Grade 10 Numeracy Assessment
- Grade 10 Literacy Assessment
- Grade 12 Literacy Assessment

French Immersion students must also complete:

• <u>Évaluation de littératie de la 12e année – Français langue seconde – Immersion</u>

- 2. Pre-Calculus 12
- 3. 2 or more additional grade 12 academic courses
- Calculus (required or recommended depending on school)

Applied Science (Engineering)

- 1. English 12
- 2. Pre-Calculus 12
- 3. Chemistry 12
- 4. Physics 12
- 5. Calculus 12 (required or recommended depending on school)

Science

- 1. English 12
- 2. Pre-Calculus 12
- 3. Science 12
- 4. Science 12
- 5. Calculus (recommended)

University Applications General

- Know your PEN!! Personal Education Number-9 digit number found on your report cards and transcripts
- Use your <u>personal email</u> address (SD45 emails accounts are deleted when you graduate)
- Have your resume/activity list available
- Have reference names/phone numbers/emails available
- Have a transcript you can reference if you need to self-report marks in the application
- Have payment option (credit card)
- YOU DO NOT NEED ANY GRADE 12 MARKS TO APPLY. UNIVERSITIES RECEIVE THESE IN DECEMBER...

Applying to Post-Secondary Institutions in British Columbia

You should have with you:

- 1. A copy of your most recent marks, grade 11 report card
- 2. PEN (Personal Education Number)
- 3. Credit Card Information







Applying to Universities Outside of BC



Ontario

To apply to universities in Ontario, students apply through the Ontario Universities'
 Application Centre (OUAC) at www.ouac.on.ca/105/

Other Provinces





 For universities outside the provinces of British Columbia and Ontario, students apply online through each university's website.

Student Transcript Service (STS) *Important*

- Must register with STS to send marks to universities-use personal email
- Need a <u>Basic BCeID</u> to register
- * These marks are sent directly from the Ministry of Education to the Institutions
- * Counsellors will walk students through the STS process in Oct/Nov.

Distributed Learning Courses Not regulated by Sentinel

Completion dates for Distributed Learning (Online) courses:

- * Courses being used for <u>admission</u> average **may** need to be completed as soon as January 31, 2026
- * Courses needed as program requirements (i.e. French 11) need to be completed by the end of June, but preferably by May so it gets onto their transcript

AP Exam Marks

Sending AP Score Reports to Universities:



- Only need to be sent if you choose
- Sent for admission purposes or advanced standing
- For AP exams taken in previous years or in this year: go to the myap.collegeboard.org and request score report to be sent to the university or college of your choice.

What do they consider?

- * Most use the Common Application
- * https://www.commonapp.org/
- * Marks for grades 9-12
- * Character and personal qualities
- * Student essays and personal statements are important
- * Counsellor Recommendation Letter
- * Teacher Recommendation Letters-subject based
- * Context of school reflected in School Profile
- * Good website: collegedata.com

UK & International Admissions

UC/\S

- * Research is the key!
- * Dates can be early, i.e. Oxford or Cambridge is Mid-September if want an interview in Canada
- * May be entrance exams such as UKCAT
- * Website: <u>www.ucas.com</u> for UK schools
- * Studying in a foreign country can involve a complex VISA process
- * Sentinel UCAS Buzzword: Sentinel2026

What happens after I apply?

Mostly patiently wait

- * Self-Report marks when university portals open (depends on the university)
- * Watch for incoming emails from the universities
- * login into university portals
- * Give universities access to Student Transcript Service (STS)
- * Admission based on both grades, and personal profiles.
- * Schools will make "conditional offers" until they receive all final marks at the end of the year

Types of Scholarships

* Three Types:

University	Community	Sentinel
-application may or may not be separate to university application -check financial/scholarship pages on university website -some are automatic based on your average -options for financial need	-applications separate for each one -can find them advertised on google classroom -can search them on internet -may require reference letter -Search engines: https://www.scholarshipsc anada.com/ https://studentawards.com https://scholartree.ca/	-application available in March -must be in 7 face to face courses to be eligible -academic, creative and athletic and financial need options available
