Dear Sentinel Families:

It has been a busy first term at Sentinel this fall. Students and staff have been hard at work in and out of the classroom. We are very proud of the many achievements, both curricular and extra-curricular, of all the members of our school and community.

The school year started with great excitement as students tested out our spectacular new gym floor. September also hosts a number of back to school events with a highlight being our student lead Truth and Reconciliation Week. Breakthrough Junior Science Challenge- Congratulations!

Grace Guo, a grade 11 student who participated in the Breakthrough Junior Science Challenge was the winner of the North American popular vote.

- Regional Winner: She was named the 2025 Popular Vote Regional Champion for North America.
- Scientific Focus: Her winning entry explored "The Gut-Brain Axis: Do We Have a Second Brain?"
- Global Recognition: As a regional champion, she was recognized alongside other top scorers from around the world, such as students from Nigeria, India, and Australia, for her ability to simplify advanced biological concepts for a general audience.

Math Contests Results- Congratulations!

Mr. Ma would like to share some of our recent Math contest results as they are quite remarkable.

- As a school, **we ranked 3rd in the province on the CIMC and 7th on the CSMC contest.** These results placed us 15th and 27th in Canada respectively! These are both contests hosted by the University of Waterloo.
- Our school champion on the CIMC contest – Albert Jiang (grade 10) is now a back-to-back **national** champion on this contest. He won a cash prize from the University of Waterloo for his results.

- **As a school, we have 19 students rank in the top 25% all contestants on the CIMC, and another 8 students rank in the top 25% on the CSMC.**
- Our school champion on the AMC 12 contest – A Grade 10 student is **ranked in the top 1% of all contestants on the AMC 12 in Canada.** In addition, while the results are not final, he also scored 74/80 on the COMC contest. Which will very likely earn him top honours in BC and a good chance of being invited to the Canadian Mathematical Olympiad.
- We have 12 students rank in the top 25% of all contestants on the AMC 10 and another 7 rank in the top 25% of all contestants on the AMC 12 as well.

Cyber Security E-Bulletin



Cybersecurity, Artificial Intelligence and Quantum Computing is a hands-on, project-based course offered to students in Grades 10-12 who are attending Rockridge, Sentinel or West Van Secondary. Students learn the theory and apply it to practical projects in the fields of Cybersecurity, Artificial Intelligence and Quantum Computing. They have an opportunity to prepare for external certifications in Cybersecurity, Networking, Internet of Things, Programming, CompTIA, and Data Science. Students also participate in international competitions such as CyberPatriot and others. The course aims at helping students

prepare material they can use for university applications.

AI Literacy Lessons

This school year, our district is introducing a series of AI literacy lessons to help students build essential knowledge and understanding of artificial intelligence. Approximately once a month, students will participate in short, age-appropriate lessons that explore key concepts and responsible use of AI. This month, primary students learned about what Artificial Intelligence is, intermediate students explored bias and effective prompting, and secondary students examined prompting, bias, and hallucinations. As AI becomes increasingly present in our everyday lives, these lessons are designed to provide our students with an understanding of the technology, as well as the skills to use it safely, ethically and responsibly.

Parents Guide to Social Media and Digital Devices Updates

Over the first term, students and staff have worked hard to follow the West Vancouver Schools Personal Digital Device (PDD) expectations. Classrooms are more focused, transitions are smoother, and students tell us they can concentrate better without the pull of their phones. Thank you to families for reinforcing these habits at home.

As we return to school after the winter break, please help us keep this momentum going by reminding your children of the digital device expectations while at school.

What's expected at school:

- **Elementary (K–7):** Cell phones are not used during the school day, including before and after school and at recess and lunch times. Laptops may be used to support learning during instructional time, only with explicit staff permission.
- **Secondary (8–12):** Cell phones and other digital devices should only be used during instructional time with explicit staff permission. Device use should be intentional, supervised, and tied to learning.

How families can help:

Parents and guardians are encouraged to support schools by demonstrating these expectations whenever possible. This includes limiting adult cell phone use in and around school and refraining from contacting your child during school hours.
