Garden Update- Rachel Clearwater

- Mrs. Phillips class has been working on a rock border this week for the outdoor learning space
- There is room for a tree in the outdoor learning space, decision pending on type
- There are some garden areas that didn't fare well over the dry summer; they will be replanted or could be replaced with something lower maintenance, such as sword ferns
- Nov. 2-Mrs. Zandvliet's class will plant bulbs chosen for the hardiness and cost efficiency

Hot Lunch Update- Jess Jenkin

- Subway was late with hot lunch order one day due to an equipment failure. This is expected to be a one-off occurrence.
- Parent suggestions of pizza vendor replacement (due to high cost) and the addition of a Monday menu will be considered.
- Parents, interested in alternating menus weekly for hot lunch, can manually adjust this
 (adjustment available only when ordering is open) by creating an order, deleting dates
 for alternating weeks, and then creating a second order for the same day, but this time
 delete the opposite dates, ensuring that each week has an alternating menu item for

DPAC report- Shevaun Brown

- Once they are assigned, the new school board trustees will be invited to PAC meeting
- Goals moving forward will be to reduce the budgeted 2022-23 structural deficit
- Encouraging reduction of cars driving up to schools and support parents/schools address safety concerns and promote alternatives
- Members of the BC General Employees' Union employed by BC Public Service have ratified a new agreement, which includes West Van employees in our district. Therefore, there will be no chance of strike for support workers.
- Overall enrollment is WV schools is up slightly from last year. Enrollment from within WV is declining, but enrollment from North Vancouver, Vancouver, as well as international students is keeping enrollment up.
- Every student, grade 11 and younger, will take an indigenous focused course as part of their graduation requirement.
- A Student and Family Affordability Fund will be made available in the future, to offset the challenges of inflation for parents. Details to come.

- The Book Fair is approaching and there will be opportunities for parents to view online as well as in person.
- Kids will be able to go by the Book Fair with their classes and during recess times
- There will be an evening Family Event 6:00-7:30pm Wednesday, Nov. 2nd
- Parent volunteers are still needed for the event
- There is a tiered reward system offered by Scholastic Books. Higher the sales mean a higher reward, which will be put towards other initiatives to benefit GEC students

Treasurer's Report- Amanda Clark

- For our Balance Sheet, we have a cash balance of just over \$172,654 as of October 17th, 2022. This is a total of our three bank accounts, which includes our trust account.
- Our total liabilities is \$88,026, with the majority made up of outdoor enhancement accruals (basketball court and playground equipment, etc.), followed by hot lunch vendor accruals.
- Income and expenses up to October 17, 2022 We had a bit more activity in the last 4 weeks, with the Golf Tournament, Hot Lunch, and babysitting/stay-at-home courses happening. We raised \$6,770 from the golf tournament on October 6th, \$6,986 for hot lunch, and \$1,247 with the babysitting stay at home course. Our Province of BC Gaming Grant also came in at \$5,280 (based on \$20/student, at 264 students).
- The cost of \$5,358.52 in Capital Upgrades, Equipment and Supplies is for classroom funds, STEAM, and the Principal's Discretion

Principal's Report-Robyn Evans

- Thank you to everyone who attended the Welcome Back Open House. It was wonderful
 to see so many families take part. Thank you to Rachel Clearwater and Lisa Lee for their
 contributions coordinating the event and meal. Thank you as well for all the
 contributions families made to World Teachers' Day.
- Cross-Country completed a successful year with multiple high-placing finishes. Thank you to all of the parents who volunteered their time.
- A few parents have yet to complete the online policy and procedure forms. Mrs. Pistilli will be contacting parents to fill these out immediately, as they are now overdue.
- The drama workshop has been postponed; hopefully, it will be rescheduled in the New Year or sooner, depending on staff availability. Update since the meeting: this has been rescheduled for February.
- FSA's are close to completing and results are expected to follow soon after
- A new playground monitor will be starting soon. She will be there for one hour daily to monitor recess. Welcome to GEC, Narges!
- We have been fortunate to receive an increase in ELL time this year. Our staff allocation
 will increase from one day each week to two. Update on how this might impact ELL
 staffing to follow.
- There will be a primary parade on Monday, October 31st, for Halloween. All students are invited to wear costumes; however, masks, weapons and accessories are not permitted. Costumes should be worn to school (no changing into costumes at school) and should not inhibit movement. Costumes must be school appropriate for K-7 setting. Parents are asked to limit Halloween treats in school to a maximum of 3 treats per day for 3 days after Halloween.
- The GEC food drive to Scare Hunger will continue through to Monday, October 31st.
