- We hosted our second term teacher appreciation lunch on Tuesday, March 7th. Thank you to Heather Nelson for organizing the sign up and distributing it to the class parents and to all who contributed to making that a special lunch for the teachers and staff.

Treasurer's Report- Amanda Clark

Statement of Financial Position as of March 28, 2023

- We have a cash balance of \$166,424. This is a total of our three bank accounts, including the trust account.
- Our total liabilities are \$73,090. Our two large accruals including \$42,012 for hot lunch vendor accruals and \$28,343 for the outdoor enhancement accrual (basketball court and playground equipment, etc).

Statement of Profit and Loss

- The GEC Spring Stampede was a successful parent social, with 120 tickets sold. Our profit for the event was \$3,823.
- Hot Lunch profits year-to-date is ~\$24k, with the Spring 2023 orders now in.

Some recent notable enhancement expenditures include:

- 1. Under Sea mural by Tracey Hayes in the large undercover space (~\$4,700)
- 2. Capital Upgrade in Digital equipment with a new Apple Macbook (~\$2,600)
- 3. Young Actors Project Drama workshops (\$2,800) and the License for the Spring School Musical (~\$1k)

Proposed Budget Amendment-Kelly Kerklaan

We are proposing to reallocate funds initially budgeted for the Outdoor Enhancement Initiative to gymnasium upgrades. We have completed all proposed projects in the Outdoor Enhancement Initiative, so we do not need the funds for that line item. The gymnasium needs new front curtains (current ones don't match and are broken), new retractable basketball hoops and the lowering of the secondary side hoops. The funds reallocated would pay for these upgrades.

The PAC was asked to vote on whether they supported the budget amendment as proposed. A vote was taken and passed.

Outdoor Enhancement Update-Kirstie Simpson

- Tracey Hayes has finished the Under the Sea mural in the undercover area. This is the third mural Tracey has done for us and it has totally transformed that space from a dark, dingy space to a bright, inviting space.
- Facilities has also completed fixing/installing lights in the undercover area. Combined with the new mural, it has really improved the space.
- We hope to have the benches that the West Van woodworking students made us last year installed soon by facilities.
- We are considering resurfacing the gaga ball pit with a rubberized paint, so the students don't need to wear gloves or get bloody knuckles.
- Rachel Clearwater is ordering a garden board to be placed by the garden at the bottom of the stairs leading to the underground area. It will be an outdoor message board for information regarding current and upcoming garden projects.
- The outdoor basketball court will be resurfaced in July. The new surface the school colours (green and grey) with our school logo at centre court.

Thank you to everyone who has donated to this project and to all the volunteers who have helped along the way.

Garden Update- Rachel Clearwater
