### Blanket Exercise coming to a school near you - Tanja

At the beginning of January, the WVS DPAC was able to experience the Blanket Exercise. It was an incredibly powerful learning opportunity, and we would like to broaden the impact of this experience by offering three more session hosted in family of schools.

The blanket exercise uses Indigenous ways of teaching and knowing to build understanding of our shared history by walking participants through pre-contact, treaty making and colonization from the Indigenous perspective. It is a participatory history lesson designed by Indigenous elders to foster truth and understanding.

We are very fortunate to have three sessions facilitated by two amazing Indigenous Educational Leaders - Stephani Maki (Coquitlam District Principal of Indigenous Education) and Brad Baker (Associate Superintendent of Indigenous Education, Ministry of Education and Child Care) being brought to West Vans PACs.

Due to the nature if the activity, space is limited to 50 participants at each FOS Blanket Exercise – location TBA. We have assigned schools with an equitable allotment of seats. We will be reaching out to chairs in the coming week to begin the process of getting their list of attendees per school. PACs can decide how they want do gather attendees, we are recommending a first come, first serve basis with a time stamp so we can have a waitlist going. This event is high in demand. - Recruitment continues to be both a priority and challenge. Numbers of postings have increased substantially this year. HR team is trying to be creative and do things differently.
- Both the WVTA and WVMEA collective agreements have been ratified. This should lead to some stability over the next few years.

### Superintendent's Report – Chris Kennedy

Linear timetable – it was announced that secondary schools will adopt linear timetable in 2023-24. Reasons to change

- Both IB and AP exams are held in May. Students have challenges if the AP courses are in the first semester.
- Academies programs are linear easier to set up timetable for both regular courses and Academies
- Will keep the flexible time blocks

2023-24 Registration – call for members to talk to people about getting into our kindergarten grade.

Liaison Meetings – important, make sure the schools get represented.
