



# **Roots of Empathy**

This year Mrs. Robertson's grade 1/2 class welcomed the Roots of Empathy program into their classroom. Roots of Empathy is an evidence-based program involving guided observation of a baby's emotions and development throughout the school year. Baby Avery and his mom Emily visited regularly and captured everyone's hearts! Students learned to tell how Avery was feeling during his visits, which led to great discussions about empathy and understanding of how their peers are feeling. Research has shown that if

school-aged children can understand how their classmates are feeling, they are less likely to engage in unkind behaviour and are more likely to act in a caring manner. Division 10 had lots of fun getting to know Avery, celebrating his developmental milestones, and fostering empathy in the classroom. Thank you to the GEC PAC for funding this important program!

We are very fortunate at Gleneagles to have one of our GEC parents, Heather Nelson, who is a trained and qualified Roots of Empathy instructor. Heather



has been delivering this program to our students for several years now and we hope to continue this valuable program next year. Thank you, Heather!

### **Traffic Advisory**

Please be advised that the Highway Underpass, located on Marine Drive between Horseshoe Bay Drive and Gleneagles Ch'axáý Elementary School, will undergo major seismic/deck retrofit work. Hours of construction will be Monday to Friday, between 7:30 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., and Saturdays, between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., or as required to complete the project. Traffic accessing the underpass from westbound HWY 1 Exit 2A/Eagleridge and southbound from Horseshoe Bay Drive will be maintained; however, traffic accessing the underpass to eastbound HWY 1 and northbound Horseshoe Bay Drive will be rerouted via a signed detour route through Horseshoe Bay Village. <a href="Detour Plan.pdf">Detour Plan.pdf</a>

**Band Registration:** If your child is entering grade 6 or 7 in September and would like to join Band for the 2024-25 school year, please register through this link: <u>Elementary Band Program</u>.

Please note that staffing for next school year is dependent on the number of registrants for the Band program, and so we are encouraging families to register soon in order to help us secure the successful continuation of our Band program at GEC.

**BYOD Program:** All students entering grades 4 through 7 are asked to Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) to school to support student learning in the classroom. Students are asked to bring a laptop to school rather than a tablet as laptops are more conducive to the learning activities and tasks that students will be involved in. A very reasonable option for families is a <a href="Chromebook">Chromebook</a>. This device is very affordable and durable laptop option that has all of the required features that students will need.

**Bus Transportation:** Students living in the Lions Bay corridor between Gleneagles and Lions Bay are eligible to use the district bus service for the 2024-25 school year, if they complete an online registration form. **Online registration is now open here** and parents are asked to <u>register now.</u>

**IMPORTANT:** All Returning & New students' parents/guardians must submit an online request form for their eligible student(s). In order to adhere to legislated requirements to maintain accurate bus lists, registration is required for all school bus riders. Registration must occur prior to **July 15** of each year through an online request form on the district's website to be considered during the bus routing process. Please note that **school bus space may not be guaranteed for students that do not submit an Online Registration Form** (<a href="https://westvancouverschools.ca/transportation-form">https://westvancouverschools.ca/transportation-form</a>) or register after the deadline (July 15, 2024).
