Seismic Upgrades Overpass – Traffic Update

Phase 1 of the seismic retrofit improvements, being performed on the south side the Marine Drive Underpass (above Highway 1/BC Ferries), are nearly complete. Phase 2 will commence immediately afterward on the north side of the structure. The same traffic arrangement and detour conditions as outlined above will remain

but be flipped onto the south side of the bridge deck (this would include all vehicle, pedestrian, and cyclist traffic). The contractor is currently targeting the end of October to switch over to Phase 2.




