FAST Program (Lifeguard Training):

• Led by Dave Dickinson at Rockridge Secondary.

Students obtain Bronze Medallion, Bronze Cross, Standard First Aid

certifications.

• Hands-on experience at West Van Community Center.

Q&A:

• Q: What are the prerequisites for FAST?

A: Students must pass a swimming assessment and demonstrate leadership qualities.

• Q: Does completing the FAST program guarantee employment?

A: While many graduates are hired at local pools, students must still pass final

certification tests.

• Q: Is there a cost associated with the program?

A: Yes, but financial assistance may be available through the school district.

YELL Program (Entrepreneurship & Leadership):

• Open to Grade 11 & 12 students.

• Provides course credits and university recognition.

• Free to students as a non-profit initiative.

Q&A:

• Q: What are the eligibility requirements for the program?

A: Students must be in Grade 11 or 12 and submit an application. There is no GPA

requirement, but an essay submission is required.

• Q: Are there costs associated with YELL?

A: No, the program is free and a nonprofit program.

• Q: What are the benefits of participating?

A: Students gain real-world experience, networking opportunities, and an edge in university applications.
