Use of Personal Devices in School

As we begin the new year, we are asking all students and families to recommit to reducing cell phone use and to the school district's Personal Digital Device expectations. Consistent routines after the break help students re-engage quickly, keep instruction on track, and reduce distractions in shared spaces.

Expectations at a glance:

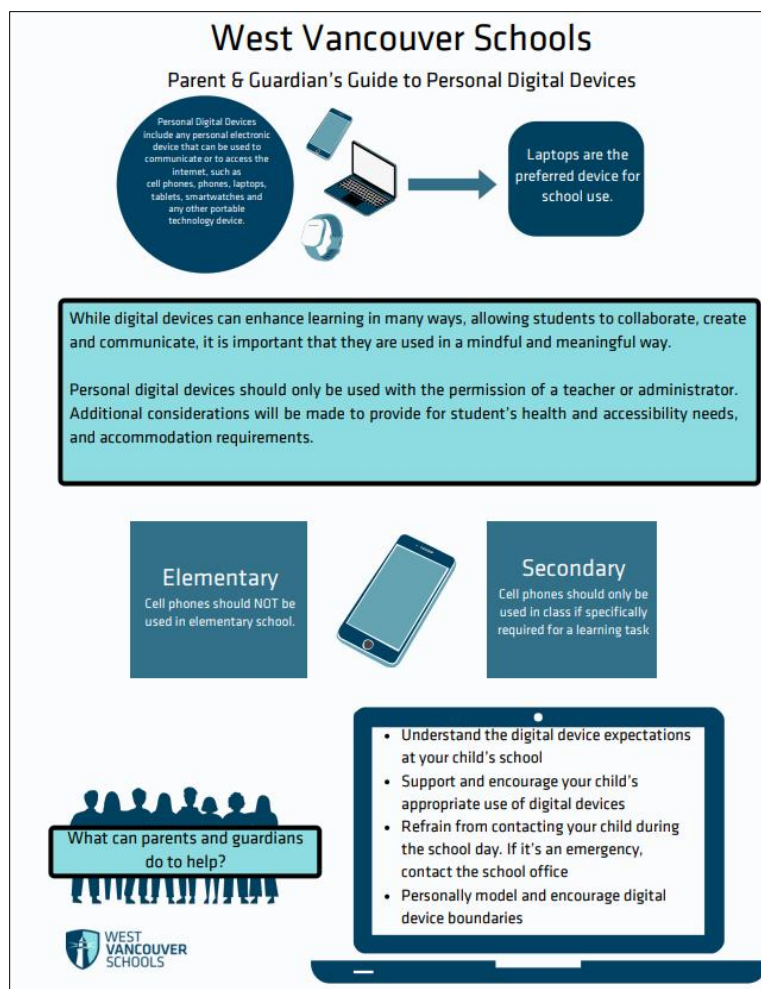
Elementary (K–7): Cell phones are not used during the school day, including before and after school and at recess and lunch times. Laptops may be used to support learning during instructional time, only with explicit staff permission.

Secondary (8–12): Cell phones and other digital devices should only be used during instructional time with explicit staff permission. Device use should be intentional, supervised, and tied to learning.

Family actions that make a difference:

- Minimize adult cell phone use in and around school
- Refrain from sending your child texts or calls during the school day; contact the office for urgent needs only.
- Review the school district's guidelines for personal digital device expectations.
- Help your child understand that when schoolwork requires technology that they need to choose a laptop over a phone as it helps to reduce distractions and support learning

Thank you for working with us to uphold these important expectations.



Student Illness

As we move into the winter months and cold and flu season, this is a reminder for parents to keep sick kids at home when they are not feeling well. Students should be able to actively participate in school activities and sit in class through a long day of learning.

Please keep your child at home if they:

- Have a fever
- Are too sick to take part in all normal school activities
- Have a suspected or known communicable disease
- Is vomiting or has diarrhea
- Students should be symptom free for 24 hours before returning to school.

Rocks & Rings

We are looking forward to Rocks & Rings, a program presented by Curling Canada, who will visit Gleneagles next week on **January 12 and 13**. All students will have an opportunity to participate in some drills, relays and activities that introduce students to the sport of curling with a focus on FUN. There is no cost for this activity due to the generosity of the GEC PAC - thank you for supporting enriching programs for our students.

Ice Skating at WV Arena

We have some skating sessions booked at the West Van Ice Arena and all students will have an opportunity to enjoy one skating session with their classmates. **January 29, February 5 and February 12th** are the scheduled dates, students will travel via school bus for skating, and there will be an activity fee of \$10 per student. The cost is the same regardless if students bring their own skates or require rentals. Permission forms will be sent home on Monday and parents are asked to check their [School Cash Online](#) account for payment.

Students will be divided into grade groups for skating (not by division/classroom). Please read the permission form for specific details regarding dates, times and required clothing items such as helmets, warm pants, mitts, etc.

Thursday, February 12th	9:30-10:45 am, Div 1, 2, 3, & 4 All Grade 6's only	10:45-11:30 am, Div 1 and 2 All Grade 7's only

Hot Lunch for Term 2

Please note that the Munch-A-Lunch is constantly open now as we have **removed the open and close windows**. Parents have access to login and place or change orders at any time! You are encouraged to order for the full term ahead, however you will now be able to go back in and make changes up to two weeks before each delivery date.

Orders will automatically close at 8pm, 14 days before each lunch delivery, giving families greater flexibility to adjust their orders. When making changes, **please double check the new start date** for your child's lunch and remember that any changes will take effect after two weeks.



For example: parents go into Munch-A-Lunch and place an order for the entire term, your child comes home and says "I don't want mac and cheese anymore". You can now go back to Munch-A-Lunch, go to the mac & cheese days, change the order, and then tell your child "you will have to eat your mac & cheese for 2 more weeks until it changes to the new order".

Act Create & Play

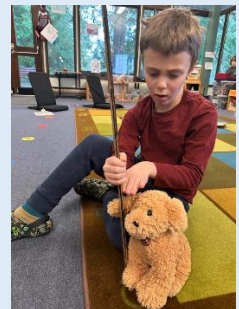
