HALLOWEEN REMINDERS

We ask that students and families observe the following guidelines to ensure a fun and safe Halloween at Hollyburn:

- •Feel welcome to dress in a costume (or Halloween colours) if you wish •Avoid masks students need to be able to fully see where they are going and staff needs to recognize all students
- •Do not bring any item that resembles a weapon
- ·Wear something comfortable that can be worn all day and can withstand being outside in any weather
- Be mindful that the costume is school-aged appropriate, remembering that there are students from age 4 to 13 participating Avoid scented items that might irritate others (e.g. some hair colouring products)
- •Come to school in your costume; students won't be able to visit the washroom for the purpose of costume updates

SCHOLASTIC BOOK FAIR

The Scholastic Book Fair is coming to Hollyburn <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>November 8th and Friday</u>, <u>November 10th</u>, <u>2023</u>. The Scholastic Book Fair is an annual event that motivates children to keep reading, which in turn fosters reading and comprehension strategies.



Students will visit the Book Fair with their class on either Wednesday, November 8th or Friday, November 10th where they will have the option to purchase books with cash, debit or credit cards. As we have done for a number of years, this year there will be only books and some writing tools for purchase, no plastic toys. The Book Fair will also be open Wednesday from 4:00-5:30pm for parents only to shop.

Families are encouraged to purchase a book to donate to their child's classroom library. The **Teacher's Classroom Wish List** for these suggested books will be posted at the Fair.

The Scholastic Book Fair is a major fundraiser for library resources. For every \$10 spent at the Fair, up to \$6 goes back to our school to buy books and educational resources. Proceeds from this year's Fair will go towards purchasing books by Canadian authors, high interest topics and books to support a wide variety of student interest and curriculum needs.
