Principal's report, Ms. Lloyd:

- Thank you to the HPAC for the Tech, IPads & Chromebooks. The tech has been delivered and is up and running
- Thank you to the HPAC for staff mid year luncheon
- Grade 7 Basketball has started, new jerseys were purchased
- DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills) assessments are underway
- Space Centre Field trip was a success
- There is a new librarian, Ms. Bysrom, has started at the school
- New Div 4 teacher, Ms. M, has replaced Ms. Kiley who is now on mat leave. Congratulation to Ms. Kiley and her family!! We wish her all the best

Looking ahead:

Playground upgrade is booked and scheduled to begin in March. Parts of the playground will
have new terf which will improve drainage and accessibility for people with mobility issues. The

- west side of the playground will have a terf slope into the playground, replacing the current stairs
- Wonka Musical: auditions are underway. Many parent volunteers are needed to help with set construction, costumes, hair & makeup..
- Bathroom upgrades: the WV school board will be upgrading the plumbing and fixtures the girls and boys bathrooms in summer 2025
- Grade 7 promotion ceremony will be held on Thursday June 19. There will be communication to grade 6 and 7 families looking for volunteers to be part of a grad committee which will plan and organize the grade 7 promotion ceremony.

DPAC update:

- School safety assessments are complete, some short term fixes are being done now (such as line painting and traffic signage). Some longer term fixes will be done in the summer, including sidewalk repairs and speed bumps
- School traffic and safety mini grants (\$300) are still available. Some ideas for usage include: walking/biking/bussing to school communication, drive to 5/park and walk initiative, student active travel art projects, school travel surveys, walk and wheel to school events and initiatives.
- If anyone has some ideas and would like to chair a traffic safety committee at Hollyburn feel free to come to the next HPAC meeting
- By election for new WV school trustee will be held on April 5th. Voting will be held at WV community centre
- West Vancouver School Board is in the budget consultation phase of the 2025/2026 school year.
 They are soliciting feedback on the following:
 - o what new of emerging priorities should the district consider for the 2025/26 budget?
 - Looking for specific suggestions and general guidance to the district leadership team and the board of education
- Cyber security, there have been ransomware attacks on school boards. There will be a
 presentation at the March DPAC meeting on Cyber security
- West Van Place for Sports is now open. Rubber terf to be laid when the weather permits and there will be a bubble over the gravel field. The facility is used during the day by WV Schools and after hours by WV Soccer Club
- West Van High School academies and district programs, there were student presentations on 2 programs:
 - the YELL Program (Youth Entrepreneur Leadership Launchpad). Students receive training and mentorship on business and entrepreneurial skills
 - and the FAST program (First Aid Swim Training), students in grades 9-12 take 2 courses and are able to receive the prerequisites to enroll in the National Lifeguard Course (which they can take when they are over 15 year old). Completion of the National Lifeguard Course is the final credential necessary to qualify as a lifeguard
