
## Hollyburn This Week



### IMPORTANT: TRAFFIC SAFETY AT HOLLYBURN



#### **Traffic & Drop-Off Safety Reminder**

We've noticed a dramatic increase in unsafe and dangerous driving during student drop-off and pickup times. Despite additional supervision and traffic patrols, we continue to see cars stopping in unsafe areas and students exiting vehicles mid-road.

For everyone's safety, we rely on our families to model safe and respectful driving habits around the school. Please review the map above and help us keep all students safe by following the reminders below.

#### **Drop-Off & Pick-Up Guidelines:**

- Drop-off is permitted along Duchess and 13th ONLY.
- If you're dropping off on Esquimalt, please park and walk your child onto the school site, always using designated crosswalks.
- Do not stop in the middle of the road or let your child jump out of the car. This is extremely dangerous and puts both your child and others at risk.
- Avoid blocking driveways or double-parking. It creates congestion and unsafe conditions for pedestrians.
- Consider parking a block away and walking in. It reduces congestion and gives your child a calm, safe start to their day.
- Arrive a few minutes early. A calm drop-off is a safe one rushing increases risk.

We appreciate your cooperation and commitment to student safety. Together, we can ensure that every child arrives and leaves Hollyburn safely each day.



## DIBELS

(Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills)







At Hollyburn, all students, K to 7, complete DIBELS (Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills) assessments three times a year — in the fall, winter, and spring. These short, one-minute assessments help teachers understand how students are progressing in key areas of early reading development.

DIBELS measures skills such as phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and reading comprehension — often referred to as the Big Ideas of reading. The goal is to identify where each student is thriving and where additional support might be needed to strengthen foundational literacy skills.

The information gathered allows teachers to tailor instruction, monitor growth, and provide targeted support so every student continues to develop as a confident, fluent reader. Each assessment is quick, taking only a few minutes, and does not require any preparation from families — it simply provides a snapshot of your child's reading progress, much like a thermometer gives a quick measure of overall health.

As part of Hollyburn's
Year 1 Framework for
Enhancing Student
Learning (FESL), we will be
sharing more throughout
the year about our
literacy practices, what
we are doing school-wide
to support student
growth in reading and
writing, and ways families
can help foster literacy
development at home.


# HALLOHEEN at Hollyburn

We know it may seem early, but Halloween is just around the corner – and many of our students are already getting excited about costumes, decorations, and treats! Below, you'll find some important reminders about costume guidelines should your child wish to participate (dressing up is completely optional).

## HALLOWEEN COSTUME REMINDERS

As we prepare to celebrate Halloween at Hollyburn, we ask that students and families keep the following guidelines in mind to ensure the day is fun, inclusive, and safe for everyone:

- Costumes are optional. Students are welcome to wear a costume, Halloween colours, or regular clothing whatever makes
  them feel comfortable.
- Halloween is still a learning day. Please make sure costumes allow students to participate comfortably in classroom and physical activities throughout the day.
- Avoid cultural stereotypes. Please do not wear costumes that appropriate or misrepresent other cultures.

- Be kind and inclusive. Halloween is meant to be fun for everyone. Please remind students to be respectful of others' costumes and choices including those who choose not to dress up.
- No masks that cover the face. Students must be able to see clearly, and staff need to be able to identify all students.
- · No weapons or weapon-like accessories.
- Wear comfortable, weather-appropriate clothing that can be worn all day, including outdoors.
- Choose safe footwear suitable for recess and regular activities no high heels, oversized shoes, or items that could cause tripping.
- Keep costumes school-appropriate for a community with students aged 4 to 13.
- · Avoid scented products (e.g., hair sprays or colouring) that may cause allergic reactions or sensitivities.
- Arrive in costume. Students should not use washrooms to change or update costumes during the day.
- Think green! Whenever possible, reuse or repurpose costume pieces to help reduce waste.
- Leave Halloween candy at home. Candy (and the excitement around it!) can be a distraction from learning. If candy is brought, it may be held until the end of the day.
- If classes plan to celebrate with treats, please confirm with teachers ahead of time and ensure items are allergy-aware and
  inclusive of all students.
