You will need to be able to get into MyED BC Family Portal to view and download your children's Term 1 Reports which will be delivered to your inbox on Dec 15th. You may need to check your junk folder for an email sent to you from Ms. Verdicchio last week. If you don't receive an email please contact Ms. Verdicchio at Lverdicchio@wvschools.ca.

Please follow the instructions on that email carefully to initialize the account by replacing the temporary password – be sure to choose a password that you will be able to easily recall in March and June for those reports. This must be done on a **COMPUTER** and will **not** work on a phone or tablet.

Please note that families who already have set up their Family Portal (through a different district or have an older child at a secondary school) will not have received this email.
