Irwin Park PARENT & VISITOR Sign In Protocol — REVIEW and REMINDER

If you are visiting the school building, volunteering, simply dropping something off, picking up your child for an appointment, etc. **please be reminded of the following general protocols:**

Visitors & Volunteers

- Please enter the school via the **front doors only** and make your way immediately to the office to sign-in. **If you are entering via another entrance**, **pls be aware visitors are still required to sign in at our front office**.
- Please be sure to have made prior arrangements before entering learning spaces during the school day (i.e., do NOT enter your child's classroom, even if it's just to drop off a lunch or project, these items should always be left at the office, so as not to disrupt the learning environment). This includes outdoor learning spaces such as the playground (recess), the garden, the outdoor classroom, etc.
- Please do not "drop in" on your child's teacher or other school staff. Email in advance or call the school to set up an appointment time. Staff are always happy to meet, but advance notice allows for us to give you our full attention at an appropriate time.

With over 450 staff and students in our building, our priority is keeping all of our community members safe and preserving the learning environment.

While life as a child and teen can be full of mean moments in our day-to-day experiences both in the community and at school, BULLYING is defined as a <u>repeated</u> series of PHYSICAL, EMOTIONAL or even SOCIAL threats, intimidation, or put-downs that are a result of a power imbalance that target an individual or group unfairly. Bullying can be traumatic, hurtful, and is unacceptable in our community.

We invite all community members to join us in solidarity and consider purchasing their very own Irwin Park Pink Shirt to wear in support of kindness, inclusion and empathy, something the world needs a bit more of lately.

While we work hard as a school staff, and community to eliminate bullying, it takes constant vigilance and attention to ensure that all members of our community are being treated with **respect** and **dignity**, regardless of who they are. Our PINK SHIRT Initiative is a reminder for all of us that we have a responsibility to stand up to bullying in all of its forms by being an active **UPSTANDER** rather than a spectator or **BYSTANDER** to bullying. We as parents can set an example for our children on how to deal with conflict or situations like this in a calm but assertive and respectful manner.
