### **Principal's Message & Important Announcements**

Once again a huge shout out to all of those families who joined us on our **Irwin Park Family Math Festival** in the gym on Thurs April 18<sup>th</sup>. We had a great turn out with families from all of our grades coming out to explore and challenge one another with some real number crunchers! Thank you to all of our parents and guardians who were able to support our **Emergency Student Release Drill** last Friday, April 19<sup>th</sup>. Our drill went smoothly, and we were grateful for the cooperation and patience of those parents and family-authorized guardians who came to school to pick up their child(ren). While no drill will ever prepare us fully for a true natural disaster, the steps taken and the protocol practiced are essential for our school team to spotcheck various tensions that may require addressing in our effort to ensure a safe and efficient response in case of such an event. Parents are reminded that the parent reception and ID verification process, including the exchange of identification stickers for both parents and students, is always a measured and organized approach to account for the whereabouts of all students. While it may take time and seem lengthy, by keeping track of those students released from our building, and their planned path upon release from school, while also accounting for those students remaining with us on school property, we are able to confirm the safety of all. Once again thank you for your cooperation and effort to take part.

A Term 3 presence on our school playground at Irwin Park this past month has included our newly formed **Irwin Park Peer Mediators.** This group of 12 student leaders underwent 8 weeks of conflict resolution training with a facilitator from the North Shore Restorative Justice Society, beginning their work in late October 2023. Building off of the *Circles In Schools* project that was run at Irwin Park last school year at the Gr 6 level, students applied and were vetted and trained to provide mediation skills to fellow students on the playground at each lunch recess. Whether they are monitoring our Gaga Ball Court and reminding players of the need for fair play or providing support to students struggling over the rules at the 4 Square Court or who's next on the swing set, these leaders embody our Panther P.R.I.D.E. values and set an example for those around them. A big shout-out goes to Ms. Roughley and Ms. Paquin for their mentorship and supervision of the group and we look forward to providing future opportunities for these young leaders.

This coming week our Gr 6/7 cohort will be involved in presentations on **Vaping Awareness**. Two representatives from Vancouver Coastal Health and Foundry North Shore will be speaking to students about the risks and consequences involved in vaping and other similar tobacco products. We look forward to their presentation and are hoping to be able to put together a parent education event on the same topic to help parents become better acquainted with the risks and how to be that much more prepared to support their children in the coming years.

# **Classroom Configuration & Multiage Classrooms at IP For Sept 2024**

As we head into the heart of our Spring Term, our minds start to turn to our classroom configuration for the coming school year. While Irwin Park's student registration numbers remain very strong with few remaining spaces, the pressure on classrooms district-wide in West Vancouver schools is also high. Students from around the Lower Mainland see WVSD as a leader in educational practice and student achievement. Therefore, to balance these demands we will once again be thinking creatively as we begin to configure our classrooms for the 24/25 school year.

The majority of classes at Irwin Park this school year are arranged in combined grades; this is largely in line with the large majority of classrooms in our school district. School administrative teams also must consider the potential changes to school enrolment that often occur over the summer with former students and their families moving and new families arriving. This often will delay final decisions around classroom placements until well after the first week of school in September.

We want to take this time, early in the game to remind our parent stakeholders that combined classroom arrangements are a very acceptable and sustainable arrangement for learning and is widely practiced throughout the Lower Mainland, our province, and in our country. Last spring Superintendent Kennedy has reassured parents at DPAC meetings of the rationale behind combined or multi-aged classes and the inherent benefits. More information can be found on our <u>District Website</u> on a page devoted to this subject. Irwin Park parents are encouraged to learn more about the background of <u>Combined Classes</u> as we prepare for the new school year in 24/25 as it is certain that our grade arrangements from KG through Gr 7 will
