Celebrating National Indigenous Peoples Day @ Irwin Park

June is National Indigenous History Month, and June 21st is National Indigenous People's Day.

To celebrate Indigenous culture, we are excited to invite Squamish Knowledge Keeper, [Spelexilh, Anjeanette Dawson](#) – a traditional wool weaver, knowledge keeper, storyteller, and Indigenous Educator from the Squamish Nation in to speak with all students. Students will have the opportunity to make their own wool weaving on a cardboard loom, learning about the history and revival of wool weaving in the Squamish community and learning about the history of wool weaving, the revival of weaving in our community, and the teachings that go with weaving. Workshops will take place on June 24th and 25th for all classes KG-7. We are extremely pleased and proud to have this opportunity.

Additionally, we will be highlighting [Raven and Hummingbird Tea Co](#), a Squamish Nation-owned tea company by **Cease Wyss and Senaqwila Wyss**, members of our Irwin Park community. Samples of their tea will be available in the lobby next week for students and families to enjoy. We are grateful for their sharing so our

community can learn more about the ingredients that make up not only a delicious cup of tea but hold power of inter-generational knowledge transfer and indigenous plant medicines.
