This approach allows students to engage with meaningful, age-appropriate resources and conversations, supporting deeper understanding and connection. These celebrations are rooted in our school's commitment to diversity, inclusion, and belonging, which lies at the core of our PANTHER P.R.I.D.E. values. We want every student and family at Irwin Park to feel seen, valued, and celebrated—not only this month, but every day. Across the school,

students will explore these themes in ways that reflect their developmental level and ongoing inquiry. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to your child's teacher and the principal directly.

Please take a moment to read this section so you know exactly how the app works and can set clear expectations for safe, respectful use. We are welcoming District Digital Literacy Vice Principal Cari Wilson on Wed June 11th to speak to our entire Gr 6/7 cohort about how to stay safe on Snapchat and how poor decisions online can turn consequential quickly.

Classroom Placement Input — June 5th to June 12th

Each school year, our Irwin Park staff of educators, specialist teachers, and administrators work collaboratively to create classes that are balanced and will provide an inclusive culture for learners

to thrive in. Please know that teachers begin this tentative process in the late Spring and invest a great deal of thought and effort into making the best educational decisions for organizing and placing students into classes. While our placements are not finalized until September, we take into consideration a wide range of criteria, including:

- Student social-emotional well-being and coping
- Diversity of learning needs and balancing classes
- Workable instructional groups
- Positive social groupings
- Possibilities for new and fresh friendships and leadership opportunities
- School-Based Team recommendations
- Ministry class size and composition requirements
- District enrollment pressures

Families who wish to share student-specific information to add to the factors above for next year's class placements, will be able to provide their input electronically this year between **May 29th and June 7th** ***Pls Note - Our staff spend many hours balancing classes for social-emotional well-being, diverse learning needs, class size/composition rules, and fresh friendship opportunities. Input forms are one of several factors and cannot guarantee a particular placement. Out of respect to our staff and the professional code of ethics, any input submitted **containing staff names in the form of teacher requests will not be used in the class configuration process**. We also remind parents that teacher assignments are tentative and subject to change – please do not request a specific teacher. There will be several shifts in our staff this year as we undergo a transition. Regardless of these inevitable changes, we feel strongly that we will be able to provide a safe and sound educational environment for every child that is part of our community.

- Parent input is optional and not a requirement
- Input must focus on your child's needs (e.g., learning style, social-emotional factors, etc)

Note on multi-grade classes: Owing to district enrolment patterns, combined grades will continue at Irwin Park. Research shows these groupings provide strong academic and social benefits, and teachers differentiate instruction for every learner.
