Hello Ridgeview Families,

We have our Orientation Health and Safety sessions underway and are reconnecting with our students. In preparation for next week, we have included a few reminders and provided more operational details. After this communication, we will start our Ridgeview eBulletin next Thursday, September 17th.

As a staff, we are prepared and we all know how to operate under all of the Health and Safety COVID Protocols. We have included some kid friendly language to also review with your child in this newsletter. We look forward to getting to the learning with all of our strict health and safety measures in place.

If your child has not seen the return to school video from Mr. Zerbe and Mr. Parslow, please watch it together: Welcome Back to School video .

The following information will provide families of all students with an overview of daily life and strict routines in place at Ridgeview.

Dates to Note:

SECOND WEEK OF SCHOOL:

Please note, that families of Kindergarten students have been emailed specific details for gradual entry in July and those plans will not change – please follow the gradual entry schedule.

Monday, September 14th – We will continue to use a staggered entry start based on last June's success (see below). Students will line (physically distanced, 2m) up at this year's grade entry door. We ask that parents stand back if they are on site or remain off the property to help with physical distancing. Teachers will come out and greet the students and call out their new class list. This is the final *learning cohort*. You will know who your child's teacher is then or at the end of the day when the teachers walk the students out. Your child's new teacher will also be sending a greeting email on Monday with information to start off the year.

By Monday September 14th, we will have completed class designs and honoured any parent request made before May 31, 2020. We cannot make any changes once students are inside their *learning cohort*. If a student has friends in the other class, they are able to connect with them during recess and lunch; however, our protocols still ask that students remain physically distant outside – and as Dr. Bonnie

Henry has guided us – outside presents as a safer environment. Though, once the *learning cohort* returns inside, we need to follow strict guidelines to ensure student safety and help with contact tracing.

Monday, September 14th through to Wednesday, September 16th – students will have 3 early dismissals as teachers will remain with their new *learning cohorts* for the 20 minute eating time at lunch, to help establish health and safety protocols. For these 3 days the staggered start and end times are as follows to accommodate this:

Learning Cohorts

Students will be in a *learning cohort*, which is defined in West Vancouver as the child's class plus their teacher and a designated EA if required. The idea of the *learning cohort* is to limit exposure to others. Students must minimize physical contact in the classroom, and students need to follow existing Health & Safety protocols that we set out and established in June. When students go outside for their supervised recess and lunch – they must maintain physical distance from each other (ie. No tag). Keep your hands and feet to self!

Your Learning Cohort



- Your learning cohort is <u>your</u> class, including students, teachers and EAs
- Minimal physical contact is encouraged with those in your learning group
- At recess, you can play with others in different groups but physical distancing is important



Daily Health Assessment and Illness

As a part of their daily routine, families must complete the daily health assessment (<u>BC COVID-19 Self Assessment Tool</u>) before dropping their child(ren) off at school each day. If children or staff develop any symptoms during the day, they will be isolated immediately from their class and parents will be expected to pick them up right away. They can then follow up with the correct medical professional.

Before You Leave For School...



Do a Health Check with your parents...

- Do you have a fever?
- Are you coughing?
- Do you have a sore throat?
- Do you feel unwell?



If so, you must stay home until you are better.

Staggered Schedules

We will have staggered starts, recess, lunch and dismissals. Each grade will have a designated entrance/exit, much like in June. These entrances will be reviewed during the orientation sessions.

Students must arrive on time for handwashing which is structured into routine and staffed at the start of the day - we need your continued support with this please. Remember, parents are not permitted in the building at this time and there will be no "drop offs" of personal items. There will be no hot lunch program for now – please bring your own lunch. We also ask for no "in" and "outs" with doctor's appointments, etc. If your child is having difficulty coming in we may need to ask that you try again the next day if we can not successfully receive your child. Parents, you need to practice social distancing and stand back from your child's line up. We need students and families to depart after drop off and pick up as we have staggered times to reduce people on the property all at once.

Masks

It is a personal choice at elementary if a child wishes to wear one. The school has been provided with 2 reusable cloth masks per child for them to use as needed. Students may bring in their own masks too. Adults in the building will be wearing masks in high traffic areas, when working with students from different learning cohorts when physical distancing cannot happen.

Hand Hygiene

Our stringent health and safety protocols will continue to be in place in any "stage" to maintain the calm and safe environment that we have established at Ridgeview with this past June's reopening. Students will complete hand hygiene procedures before and after eating, as well as before and after anytime they leave their classroom.

Clean Your Hands



Immediately	upon	arrival	at school.

- ☐ Before and after breaks (recess, lunch).
- Before and after eating, drinking (excluding drinks kept at a student's desk
- □ Before and after using an indoor learning space used by many, such as the gym
- ☐ Immediately after using the toilet.
- ☐ Immediately after sneezing, coughing, using a tissue.
- Whenever hands are visibly dirty.

Movement Inside the School

Inside is a controlled environment with limited movement. Students will be receiving Music and Library in their classrooms. Students only move for washrooms, waterbottle refill times, to the gym or to get outside. We have very clear signage for this and staff will guide students.

Traffic Flow

- Keep right in the Hallways and on the Stairs
- Each division will be assigned entrance / exit door

Washrooms

- 3 at a time
- Wait on the dragon footprints outside if it is busy

Water Fountains

- Bottle filling only
- Wait on the dragon footprints if it is busy



School Supplies



Don't Share Your Things



- As always, don't share your food or personal items
- Keep your water bottles, school supplies, and items from home to yourself
- Personal items should be labelled with person's name to discourage accidental sharing.
