# **SCHOOL NEWS**

## **BUILDING A SENSE OF BELONGING**

Youth Poet Laureate Amanda Gorman's inaugural poem <u>"The Hill We Climb"</u> yesterday gave me the chills and her subsequent interviews on CNN for example were so impressive. This is a


young black woman living in a country and world that is tumultuous and divisive but perhaps there is hope for unity with the change in politics down south. Everyone knows the challenges of stereotypes, racism, inclusion and inequality, and perhaps this is more magnified in the States, but Canada has its own challenges. While we are fortunate to be in a country with the Charter of Rights, or at least feel that Canada is more progressive or liberal, we still find ourselves very much engaged with what it means to be Canadian. It the differences that we need to share and embrace to truly understand one another.

With so many social justice movements shedding light on their cause and with our own cultural diversity in the Vancouver area, our Teacher-Librarian, Ms. Kennedy, is working with staff to develop a new collection of books for all ages to appropriately engage students through story about this broad and important subject matter. We recent bought a series of intermediate books/novels that address "complex world problems" (see image) that range from world migration due to political strife or environmental changes, to residential schools, to seeking equality and what this means for everyone. We are about to order \$1000 worth of books, with a more primary focus, centring on boys and girls from various backgrounds and sharing their success story as an artist, poet, business person, architect, etc.



One of the First People's Principles of Learning (see image below) is "*learning is embedded in memory, history and story*." We use this principle to gain understanding of the Indigenous plight – but we can apply this principle to many stories that bring us together to build tolerance and

understanding. We want our physical library to be relevant, current, connect what is being taught in the classroom and to create a sense of belonging for all of our students.



# FAMILY MEDITATION AND WELLNESS ZOOM WORKSHOP (GR K-7)

Do you ever feel like you are constantly running from the minute you wake up, that there aren't enough hours in the day or that you or your family members feel stressed or anxious? Learn tools to bring more mindfulness to your family's life, while creating a greater sense of peace and calm. The Meditation and Mindfulness workshop is scheduled for next **Tuesday**, **January 26th @ 7pm**. # LATE ARRIVALS (GR K-7)

We have noticed an increase in late arrivals. Please be mindful that It is very important for students to arrive on time. However, if a student does arrive late, they should report to the main entrance front doors to line up. Please do not go directly to your child's classroom door if your

# DRESSING FOR THE WEATHER (GR K-7)

Winter weather is upon us. Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for all weather conditions. Also, it is always a very good idea for all students to have an extra set of clothes/footwear at school to change into should they get wet and/or muddy.

# WEATHER CLOSURES AND PROCEDURES

As winter weather approaches, the likelihood of school disruptions due to snowfall or power outages increases. As such, we would like to provide you with some important information about the district's weather closure of schools procedures and announcements process.

The district aims to keep schools open on every regular instructional day, including those with snowfall. However, the final decision to send students to school resides with the parent or guardian since they are most familiar with the specific road and weather conditions around their home and community.

#### Weather Closure of Schools (Outside School Hours)

Any decision to close schools for the safety of children will be made by the Superintendent. Parents, students, and staff will be informed of the Superintendent's decision via:

- the school district website at www.westvancouverschools.ca; and
- a School Messenger email

We endeavour to communicate this information to parents and staff by 6:00 a.m. on the day of closure.

#### Weather Closure of Schools (During School Hours)

If weather conditions create a concern for the safety of students returning home, the school Principal can decide to dismiss school early after consulting with the Superintendent.

The decision will be communicated to parents and students using the school's normal communication system (School Messenger).

Student safety is our first priority. Every effort will be made to keep schools open, but parents are encouraged to establish a plan for their children in the event of early dismissal or school closure.

# 2021/22 REGISTRATIONS

Do you or someone you know have a child born in 2016? Now is the time to register them for Kindergarten! Admissions applications for the 2021-2022 school year are available on our website <u>here</u>. You can also find more Kindergarten information on our website <u>here</u>.

Out-of-catchment and out-of-district applications for students entering Grades 1 – 12 in 2021-2022 opened at 8am on January 15, 2021.

To complete your application, after you submit the online form, you must send good-quality electronic copies of all required documentation to your first choice school only.

If your child is currently in Grade 7 and your first choice high school is West Vancouver Secondary School, you are not required to complete an online application (regardless of where you live). West Vancouver Secondary School counsellors will be visiting Ridgeview in late winter/early spring and will be distributing transfer forms at that time. HOWEVER, if your first choice for secondary school is somewhere other than West Vancouver Secondary School (i.e. Sentinel or Rockridge), you must complete an online application – now open.
