INDIGENOUS EDUCATION

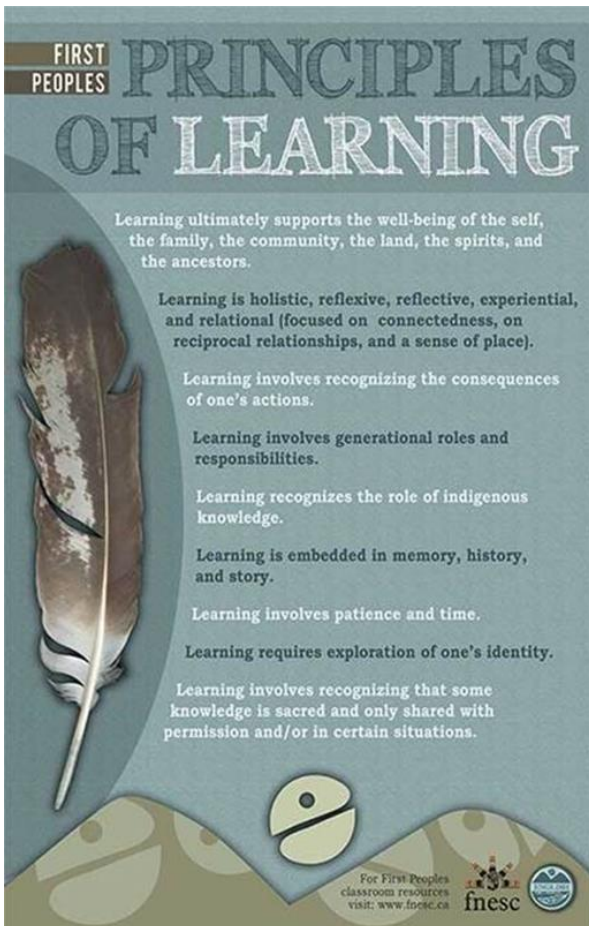
Ha7lh skwayel ta nuyap, Mr. Zerbe kwi en sna (Good day to you all, my name is Mr. Zerbe),

Tomorrow, all West Vancouver Schools staff will be participating in Professional Development Day with a focus on Indigenous Education. Through virtual learning, keynotes and videos, our Ridgeview staff will be learning how to embed Indigenous Education into everyday learning. As part of The Truth and Reconciliation

Commission, as well as with guidance from the BC Ministry of Education, our attempt is to develop comfort with this aspect of understanding, and to work with the Squamish Nation to develop how this looks in schools. For example, we currently share out a territorial acknowledgement on Monday mornings along with O Canada and at all school functions. Furthermore, Ms. Kennedy has a collection of books to learn Indigenous Education through story, and we have connections with Squamish Nation elders who come and work with us. The renewed 2020-2025 Indigenous Enhancement Agreement outlines three main goals to enhance the educational success of our First Nations, Metis and Inuit students to ensure they are supported intellectually, culturally and emotionally:

1. To use Indigenous Ways of Knowing and Perspectives to inform and empower our teaching, learning and decision-making;
2. To enhance student success by facilitating transitions and pathways throughout the K-12 Journey; and
3. To create a sense of space and belonging for Indigenous students that is inclusive to all.

We use the First Peoples Principles of Learning to help guide how we can approach the Indigenous ways of knowing through these 7 principles outlined in this visual poster that each classroom has (see below). Each teacher/cohort will be selecting 1 or 2 principles to reference with their engagement with the students, such as “learning involves patience and time.”



LATE ARRIVALS (GR K-7)

We have noticed an increase in late arrivals. Please be mindful that in order to support our COVID protocols, it is very important for students to arrive on time. However, if a student does arrive late, they should report to the main entrance front doors to line up. Please do not go directly to your child's classroom door if your child is late as it will be locked. One of our office staff will be at the front door at 9:00 am and again at 9:15 am to

admit late students, supervise hand washing and have them check into the office for a late slip. If your child is arriving late after 9:15 am, parents/guardians must accompany them to the front door and call the office at 604-981-1250 for access. Thank you for your cooperation.

DROPPING OFF ITEMS (Gr K-7)

A reminder that in order to support our COVID protocols, there should be no dropping off of forgotten items and/or lunches. Students should be prepared and be sure to have everything when they leave home in the morning – water bottle, lunch, planners, school materials and homework. Thank you for your cooperation.

DRESSING FOR THE WEATHER (Gr K-7)

Winter weather is upon us. Please ensure that your child is dressed appropriately for all weather conditions. Also, it is always a very good idea for all students to have an extra set of clothes/footwear at school to change into should they get wet and/or muddy.

WEATHER CLOSURES AND PROCEDURES

As winter weather approaches, the likelihood of school disruptions due to snowfall or power outages increases. As such, we would like to provide you with some important information about the district's weather closure of schools procedures and announcements process.

The district aims to keep schools open on every regular instructional day, including those with snowfall. However, the final decision to send students to school resides with the parent or guardian since they are most familiar with the specific road and weather conditions around their home and community.

Weather Closure of Schools (Outside School Hours)

Any decision to close schools for the safety of children will be made by the Superintendent. Parents, students, and staff will be informed of the Superintendent's decision via:

- the school district website at www.westvancouver.schools.ca; and
- a School Messenger email

We endeavour to communicate this information to parents and staff by 6:00 a.m. on the day of closure.

Weather Closure of Schools (During School Hours)

If weather conditions create a concern for the safety of students returning home, the school Principal can decide to dismiss school early after consulting with the Superintendent.

The decision will be communicated to parents and students using the school's normal communication system (School Messenger).

Student safety is our first priority. Every effort will be made to keep schools open, but parents are encouraged to establish a plan for their children in the event of early dismissal or school closure.

2021/22 REGISTRATIONS

Do you or someone you know have a child born in 2016? Now is the time to register them for Kindergarten! Admissions applications for the 2021-2022 school year are available on our website [here](#). You can also find more Kindergarten information on our website [here](#).

Out-of-catchment and out-of-district applications for students entering Grades 1 – 12 in 2021-2022 opened at 8am on January 15, 2021.

To complete your application, after you submit the online form, you must send good-quality electronic copies of all required documentation to your first choice school only.

If your child is currently in Grade 7 and your first choice high school is West Vancouver Secondary School, you are not required to complete an online application (regardless of where you live). West Vancouver Secondary School counsellors will be visiting Ridgeview in late winter/early spring and will be distributing transfer forms at that time. HOWEVER, if your first choice for secondary school is somewhere other than West Vancouver Secondary School (i.e. Sentinel or Rockridge), you must complete an online application – now open.
