Our students participated in <u>six activities</u> during the day and had <u>camp fires in the evening to share songs and skits</u>. We had a learning theme of how you participated during these activities called the Four Player System (mover, bystander, opposer, follower) to gain different perspectives of group work. Our activities included

kayaking, canoeing, team building, shelter building, low ropes and archery. Thank you to Mr. Campbell, Ms. Gardener and to Ms. Karen – our staff who were highly engaged and caring for our students. Thank you to our parent volunteers David, Gina and Shirley who assisted us with all duties assigned. ORANGE SHIRT DAY - SEPTEMBER 29TH (GR K-7)

What is <u>Orange Shirt Day</u>? Every year on September 30th, Orange Shirt Day encourages everyone to join the journey toward Reconciliation, a day commemorating the survivors of residential schools and remembering the children who did not survive. **We are encouraging students to wear something orange to school if they wish to take part on <u>September 29th</u> (as students will not be at school on September 30th). As part of our curriculum at school we address this heavy topic appropriately for different grades through stories with our Teacher Librarian, Mrs. Kennedy.**

NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION-SEPTEMBER 30TH (GR K-7)

September 30, 2022 marks National Day for Truth and Reconciliation (school is closed on this day).

The day honours the lost children and Survivors of residential schools, their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

The creation of this federal statutory holiday was through legislative amendments made by Parliament. On June 3, 2021, Bill C-5, *An Act to amend the Bills of Exchange Act, the Interpretation Act and the Canada Labour Code* (National Day for Truth and Reconciliation) received Royal Assent.

This National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, explore the rich and diverse cultures, voices, experiences and stories of the First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples. Whether you want to read, listen, or watch, start your learning journey today. Another activity worth considering is checking out the West Vancouver Memorial Library to facilitate reflection, education, and awareness. Another event to consider, to honour the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, the Kay Meek Theatre is offering West Vancouver Schools students, teachers and families the opportunity to watch the screening of the film WOCHIIGII LO: END OF THE PEACE for free on Friday, September 30 at 7pm. A reminder that there is a strict 8 day cut-off to place, cancel or edit your order. Once that cut-off has passed, NO changes can be made.

To cancel or edit your order before the 8 day cut-off, please refer to these instructions:

- Go to: My Account > View My Orders > click 'Edit' next to the order
- Follow the on-screen prompts (the system will put all FUTURE lunch dates/selections back into the 'shopping cart': items will appear on the right)
- Go to the date/menu that needs a change
 - Checkmark the item/s you wish to remove

- Click Remove
- Add any new items if desired
- When done, go to the very LAST menu > click Finished > Next > Submit.
- It's important to RE-SUBMIT your updated order in order for the child to continue receiving lunches and your account to update accordingly.
- If you removed items, and did not replace them with new items, when you re-submit the system will show a credit in your MunchaLunch account to use for future orders.

If you added more items than originally ordered, please remember to make payment for the new balance after you re-submit your edited order

To honour the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation, the Kay Meek Theatre is offering West Vancouver Schools students, teachers and families the opportunity to watch the screening of the film <u>WOCHIIGII LO: END OF THE PEACE</u> for **free** on Friday, September 30 at 7pm.

Made over five years by Haida filmmaker Heather Hatch, this impassioned documentary captures the long struggle by members of the West Moberly and Prophet River First Nations against the B.C. government over a mega-dam project that could devastate the Peace River Valley. The fact that many experts consider the Site C dam to be both unneeded and a likely money-loser for the province is one of many cruel ironies Hatch uncovers in her film, which is equally powerful as a blistering exposé and an inspirational tribute to these lands' defenders.
