THE PROUD PRINCIPAL – EARTH DAY

STUDENT LED CONFERENCES – EARLY DISMISSAL 1:00PM

Student Led Conferences is an informal reporting opportunity for students to show their parents what they have been working on and the students are showcasing their efforts to date. These are not parent teacher conferences. Other families will be in the room during the scheduled times. Student Led Conferences are scheduled for **Wednesday April 26th** and will be 20-minute sessions running between 1:00 pm and finishing at 4:00 pm.

PACK IN PACK OUT LUNCH & SNACK WASTE

We have not reviewed this in sometime, but we have noticed that we need to re-promote “Pack In Pack Out” for managing left over lunch and/or lunch waste. Metro Vancouver has introduced a ban sometime ago on the disposal of organics – including food waste and packaged food. This means food waste must be separated from regular garbage. To support this, students are asked to pack out all waste from their snacks and lunches. We have limited capacity to support this at school.

This includes all wrappings and all organic waste. Reusable containers will be necessary to keep waste to a minimum. You may want to have a large Zip Lock bag in your child’s backpack for left over hot lunch food and packaging. Please also ensure if your child requires utensils to eat their lunch that you provide a reusable one from home. We do not have extra utensils at the office. Your support is appreciated.
