Thank you for your cooperation.

STUDENT PLACEMENT INPUT REQUEST FOR 2023/2024 (GR K-6)

Our class placement process ensures that thoughtful consideration of each child's social, emotional and academic needs is aligned with the need to create balanced and effective learning environments. The assignment of students to classes is decided by a team, which includes the School Based Resource Team, a child's current teacher, non-enrolling teachers, support staff and the administrators. This professional team considers each placement carefully as they create classes that include a wide range of students who learn in a variety of ways.

In addition to individual circumstances, criteria considered in the placement process include:

- 1) Workable instructional groups considering:
 - the child's academic needs and strengths;
 - · teaching and learning styles;
 - the child's work habits
- 2) Positive social groups considering:
 - placements where a child can work positively and productively with other children in the class;
 - peer support or conflicts;
 - establishing the presence of positive leaders in each class
- 3) Balanced classes considering:
 - gender (male/female);
 - inclusive practices;
 - English Language Learners;
 - social, emotional and academic needs and abilities;
 - leadership abilities
- 4) Other information considered:
 - School-Based Resource Team recommendations

If there is information that the current classroom teacher and/or the principal does not have and should consider when placing your child, parents may wish to complete a Student Placement Input Form (attached).

Please submit any Input Forms to Mr. Zerbe (wzerbe@wvschools.ca) and "cc" your child's current classroom teacher. Input Forms are due no later than MAY 31st to be considered for student placement for the 2023/24 school year. Late request cannot be honoured. (Please also consider only making a request if there are extenuating circumstances.)

Please consider the placement criteria referenced above when describing your child's needs. If you are requesting placements that involve other students (one or two at most) please think carefully before making your request and provide an explanation for that request. Please focus on the needs of your child.

The information that you provide in your Input Form will be given to the team of professionals described above, to be used along with the criteria listed above in the placement of your child. Please note that it may not be possible to meet all requests as classes are determined. Teacher assignments are tentative and subject to change, along with enrolment and school organization change.

Reminder: Please note that **Input Forms will not be accepted if names of staff members are used in outlining your requests/concerns.** Letters containing staff names will not be used in the class building process. Our goal is to meet the needs of all students at Ridgeview in order to maximize their growth as learners. We appreciate your support in the complex multi-level process of arranging educationally sound and balanced classes.

GRADE 6/7 BAND REGISTRATION FOR 2023-24

Registration for elementary concert band is now open for the 2023-2024 school year. Band is an optional program offered to Grade 6 and 7 students where they learn an instrument to play as a group. When you are ready to register, go to the <u>District Elementary Band Program page</u>. Further information was sent out earlier directly to families of current Grade 5 and 6 students.

SCHOOL SUPPLY LISTS 2023-24

Next year's school supplies were emailed out to families last Monday.

The supply lists reflect what teachers anticipate your child will need and are individual to each grade. You will see on the list that "Part A" supplies" are purchased as a complete package. Some lists may have a "Part B". Please note these items are still required by the teacher but may be ordered individually as families may choose to reuse some of these items from year to year.

Creative Children has put together convenient and cost-effective packages and ordering the supplies through Creative Children also benefits your child as this is a RPAC fundraiser (which you will find under "Part C – Optional Items"). Please note that Part B and/or C items must be ordered at the same time as the Part A package. You are unable to go back to the website and order Part B or C items separately.

Should you choose to order school supplies through Creative Children, all ordering is done online through Creative Children (choose our School name in the drop down and the grade your child will be entering in September).

To receive FREE SHIPPING to the school: Orders must be submitted no later than June 11th.

Packs ordered by June 11th will arrive at the school before June year end dismissal to take home. Packs ordered after June 11th will be subject to a shipping fee. Should you choose not to order the supplies through Creative Children, please use the list as a guide to purchase the items on your own from a store. IF YOUR CHILD WILL BE ABSENT OR ARRIVING LATE FOR SCHOOL

It is extremely important that student absences/late arrivals be reported to the school office prior to 9:00am by either leaving a voice message on the 'Call Back' phone line at 604-981-1252 or by emailing Mrs. Lytle (slytle@wvschools.ca). Please call or email <u>EACH</u> day your child is absent or if you

know your child will be away for an extended period of time, please email Mrs. Lytle so that this information can be recorded on the Call Back 'long term' form. Also, if you will be extending your winter break holiday beyond January 2nd, please let us know. Thank you for your cooperation.

PACK IN PACK OUT LUNCH & SNACK WASTE

We have not reviewed this in sometime, but we have noticed that we need to re-promote "Pack In Pack Out" for managing left over lunch and/or lunch waste. Metro Vancouver has introduced a ban sometime ago on the disposal of organics – including food waste and packaged food. This means food waste must be separated from regular garbage. To support this, students are asked to pack out all waste from their snacks and lunches. We have limited capacity to support this at school.

This includes all wrappings and all organic waste. Reusable containers will be necessary to keep waste to a minimum. You may want to have a large Zip Lock bag in your child's backpack for left over hot lunch food and packaging. Please also ensure if your child requires utensils to eat their lunch that you provide a reusable one from home. We do not have extra utensils at the office. Your support is appreciated.

LUNCH UTENSILS - PLEASE PACK FROM HOME

A reminder to **pack a reusable fork, spoon or chopsticks from home** should your child require a utensil to eat what they have for their lunch. **This includes if they are receiving hot lunch.** In order to reduce the amount of waste produced, utensils are not provided with hot lunch and we do not have utensils available in the office.
