THE PROUD PRINCIPAL – HAPPY NEW YEARS!

As we start the new year, we often consider a resolution or two. We often need to find ways to improve ourselves. Perhaps it's a way to support your child(ren). I personally have some health goals that I want to achieve this year as well as trying to be a good and responsible parent. So, when I saw [THIS](#) at the recent WVS DPAC Liaison Meeting and the conversation around proper tech guidelines at home, I immediately thought this is how I am going to support my own child! The **10 Tips for Parenting Digital Natives** is for getting ahead of any household struggle and battle around screentime. My children, ages 7 and 9, are already quicker than I am with technology, but they don't know everything. You don't have too either. But being present and informed is going to help get you feeling confident that your child(ren) are safe and leverages the technology appropriately. Another helpful item that I thought is useful is creating a [Family](#)

[Technology/Device Agreement](#) with your child(ren). This is from [Common Sense Media](#) which is a very useful resource for parents – from technology use, to movies, to games – and making sure you are in the loop with the latest and greatest technologies, movies and games that kids gravitate towards.

DRESS FOR THE WEATHER (GR K-7)

With temperatures dropping starting tomorrow, please ensure your child is prepared with proper outerwear and footwear including, gloves, toque, scarf etc. It is also a very good idea to have a set of extra clothes (including socks/shoes) at school should your child get wet and/or muddy during the school day.

ROAD WORK ON 15TH STREET

We have been advised that starting Monday, January 15th (for 8 weeks), 15th Street will be closed for road work between Queens and Mathers. Please plan ahead and give yourself extra time to as there will be detours for this area.

STUDENT ABSENCES / LATE ARRIVALS (GR K-7)

It is extremely important that student absences/late arrivals be reported to the school office prior to 8:40am by leaving a voice message on the '**Call Back**' phone line at **604-981-1252** or by emailing Mrs. Lytle (slytle@wvschools.ca). Please call each day your child is absent or if you know your child will be away for an extended period of time (such as holidays), please email the office so that this information can be recorded on the Call Back 'long term' form. Thank you for your cooperation.

LUNCH UTENSILS (GR K-7) – REMEMBER TO PACK FROM HOME

A reminder to pack a reusable fork, spoon or chopsticks from home should your child require a utensil to eat what they have for their lunch. This includes if they are receiving hot lunch. In order to reduce the amount of waste produced, **utensils are not provided with hot lunch and we do not have utensils available in the office.**

DISTRICT WEATHER CLOSURES AND PROCEDURES

As winter approaches, the likelihood of school disruptions due to snowfall or power outages increases. As such, we would like to provide you with some important information about the district's weather closure of schools procedures and announcements process.

The district aims to keep schools open on every regular instructional day, including those with snowfall. However, the final decision to send students to school resides with the parent or guardian since they are most familiar with the specific road and weather conditions around their home and community.

Weather Closure of Schools (Outside School Hours)

Any decision to close schools for the safety of children will be made by the Superintendent. Parents, students, and staff will be informed of the Superintendent's decision via: the school district website at www.westvancouver.schools.ca and a School Messenger email

We endeavour to communicate this information to parents and staff by 6:00 a.m. on the day of closure.

Weather Closure of Schools (During School Hours)

If weather conditions create a concern for the safety of students returning home, the school principal can decide to dismiss school early after consulting with the Superintendent. The decision will be communicated to parents and students using the school's normal communication systems.

Student safety is our first priority. Every effort will be made to keep schools open, but parents are encouraged to establish a plan for their children in the event of early dismissal or school closure.

KUNG-FU KIDS AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM AT RIDGEVIEW (JANUARY 2024)!

Looking for an after-school program that helps your child develop speed, power, balance and coordination-- as well as gain practical skills in self-defence while having fun? Kung-Fu Kids is finally here on Thursdays after school at Ridgeview (in the gym) starting in January! We have 2 programs available on Thursdays:

Grades K-2: 2:45pm-3:25pm (40 minutes) - Using music, games, storytelling, and kung-fu patterns (basic kicking and punching) to learn about balance, coordination, reaction, and timing to develop better focus, listening, and gross motor function skills.

Fee: \$15/class (Thursdays, January 11 - March 7, total 9 classes).

Grades 3-7: 3:30pm-4:45pm (75 minutes) - We will begin with a general warm-up, proper stretching, body conditioning and fundamental self-defence techniques in kicking, striking, blocking, and stances/footwork. The main goal is to develop speed, accuracy and power. We will use various modern conditioning and sports equipment, as well as safety gear such as mats, striking pads and kicking shields.

Level 1 Grade testing and certification is available, but optional.

Fee: \$20/class (Thursdays, January 11-March 7, total 9 classes).
