STUDENT EMERGENCY RELEASE DRILL – MAY 16TH

On the afternoon of Thursday, May 16th, 2024, the staff and students of Ridgeview Elementary will participate in one of our annual simulated earthquake drills. This gives us an opportunity to practice part of our school's emergency preparedness plan.

The *Student Release Centre / Parent and Student Reunion Area* will be established near the portable/undercover area. You (or your designated alternate who is listed on your child's Release form) are asked to report to the east undercover area at the assigned times (see below). We suggest you walk to the school, as you would after an earthquake. Please DO NOT park in the school parking lot or bring your dog. **Important: Remember your photo ID (such as your Driver's Licence).**

We are asking that you pick up your student/alternate students at a **Staggered Pick-Up Time** based on grades. This eliminates 400+ people waiting in a line and simulates a more realistic scenario. If you are picking up more than one child, you are welcome to pick them up at the same time. If you are picking up a student that is not your child, you **must be listed as an alternate on the child's Student Release form.**

Staggered Pick-Up Times	Grades	K - 2	1:30 pm
	Grades	3 - 4	1:50 pm
	Grades	5 – 7	2:10 pm

The following procedures will take place:

1. There will be forms on tables to be filled out for **each** child you will be picking up prior to lining up at the release tables.

2. **Have your photo ID such as a BC Driver's Licence.**
Line up at one of the following table locations identified by last name listed alphabetically:
A-D, E-K, L-Q or R-Z.
3. Show your photo ID, state child(ren)'s name, teacher and grade. Receivers of the information will check your child(ren)'s Student Release Form.
4. Parent/Alternate will be given a sticker to wear, identifying student(s) for release. A 'runner' will then go collect the student(s) and bring the student(s) to the parent or alternate waiting in the Reunion/Reception Area.
5. Parent/Alternate will need to wait in the Reunion/Reception Area. Staying in this designated area ensures a 'controlled release' and maximizes the safety of all students.

NOTE: All remaining children will be dismissed at the regular dismissal time of 2:40 pm.

SCHOOL SUPPLY LISTS 2024-25

School Supply Lists were sent out yesterday and are now available on the [Creative Children](#) website and can also be found on our [school website](#) under "School News and Publications"

The supply lists reflect what teachers anticipate your child will need and are individual to each grade. You will see on the list that "Part A" supplies" are purchased as a complete package. Some lists may have a "Part B". Please note these items are still required by the teacher but may be ordered individually as families may choose to reuse some of these items from year to year.

Creative Children has put together convenient and cost-effective packages and ordering the supplies through Creative Children also benefits your child as this is a RPAC fundraiser (which you will find under "Part C – Optional Items" can be added should you choose). Please note that Part B and/or C items must be ordered at the same time as the Part A package. You are unable to go back to the website and order Part B or C items separately.

Should you choose to order school supplies through Creative Children, **all ordering is done online through [Creative Children](#)** (choose our School name in the drop down and the grade your child will be entering in September).

To receive FREE SHIPPING to the school: Orders must be submitted no later than June 10th. Packs ordered before June 10th will arrive at the school before June year end dismissal to take home. Packs ordered after June 10th will be subject to a shipping fee (\$11). Should you choose not to order the supplies through Creative Children, please use the list as a guide to purchase the items on your own from a store.

STUDENT PLACEMENT INPUT REQUEST FOR 2024/2025 (GR K- 6)

Our class placement process ensures that thoughtful consideration of each child's social, emotional and academic needs is aligned with the need to create balanced and effective learning environments. The assignment of students to classes is decided by a team, which includes the School Based Resource Team, a child's current teacher, non-enrolling teachers, support staff and the

administrators. This professional team considers each placement carefully as they create classes that include a wide range of students who learn in a variety of ways.

The driving factor that determines organization in the public school system is based on enrollment. West Vancouver School District's priority is space at each grade where possible for students to have an opportunity to attend their catchment school and/or priority choice. This is the reason Ridgeview has moved towards "multi-age classes" (otherwise known as split classes or combined classes) as have other schools in West Vancouver Schools.

Parents – please consider only making a request if there are extenuating circumstances OR to share information you feel should be considered when placing their child for the next school year.

To make a request – **please fully read the attached letter** which outline information and guidelines for making a request with the Input Form. Please submit any **Input Forms** to Mr. Zerbe (wzerbe@wvschools.ca) and "cc" your child's current classroom teacher.

Input Forms are due no later than May 17th – late requests cannot be honoured.

MOVING? CHANGING SCHOOLS?

It is very important to inform us if you know your child(ren) will **NOT** be returning to Ridgeview in September for the 2024/25 school year. Please email Mrs. Lytle (slytle@wvschools.ca) as soon as possible as it is important for us to have accurate information regarding enrollment for the upcoming school year. Thank you for your cooperation.

RETURNING TO SCHOOL AFTER SUMMER BREAK

If you are extending the summer break and returning after we begin classes on Tuesday, September 4th, please keep in mind [AP 300 Student Registration and Enrolment](#) states that the unconfirmed whereabouts of an absent registered student will be removed from the school register if the student has not returned by 3:00 pm on the Thursday after school opening (September 6th). We are experiencing long wait lists due to enrolment pressure to hold seats this year and school and district operations and planning will take priority over travel plans. Please reach out to Mr. Zerbe if you need more information or would like to review your intentions.

GRADE 6 AND 7 BAND REGISTRATIONS IS OPEN FOR 2024-2025

Registration for elementary concert band is now open for the 2024-2025 school year. Band is an optional program offered to Grade 6 and 7 students where they learn an instrument to play as a group. When you are ready to register, go to the [District Elementary Band Program page](#).

STUDENT ABSENCES / LATE ARRIVALS

It is extremely important that student absences/late arrivals be reported to the school office prior to 8:40am by leaving a voice message on the '**Call Back**' phone line at **604-981-1252** or by emailing Mrs. Lytle (slytle@wvschools.ca). Please call each day your child is absent or if you know your child will be away for an extended period of time (such as holidays), please email the office so that this information can be recorded on the Call Back 'long term' form. Thank you for your cooperation.

LUNCH UTENSILS – REMEMBER TO PACK FROM HOME

A reminder to pack a reusable fork, spoon or chopsticks from home should your child require a utensil to eat what they have for their lunch. This includes if they are receiving hot lunch. In order to reduce the amount of waste produced, **utensils are not provided with hot lunch and we do not have utensils available in the office.**
