SCHOOL NEWS

THE PROUD PRINCIPAL— SPORTS DAY!

SUMMARY OF LEARNING (REPORTS)

On Thursday, June 27th, your child's Summary of Learning Report will be published to the MyEd Family Portal as a PDF (will be located on the right-hand side of the homepage under "Published Reports"). The Summary of Learning is a written report that describes and summarizes student learning and growth across the year (not just learning that occurred in the Term Three). The Summary of Learning contains the same elements as the Learning Updates your child received at the end of Term One and Term Two (scale indicator, descriptive feedback, as well as self-reflection/goal setting). The descriptive feedback is reflective of the year and communicates strengths and areas for growth to prepare students for the next grade or course.

We suggest that you try [logging into your account](#) prior to June 27th to ensure that you are ready and have access to it for when the reports are published. If you have forgotten your password, simply use your login and click on "forgot password", and you should receive another temporary one (check your spam/junk folder if you do not receive it).

All Learning Updates #1 and #2, the final Summary of Learning Report, ELL reports (AIPs) and IEP reports will be posted on the Family Portal for the 2023/24 school year **until July 31, 2024. Paper copies will not be sent home**, so it is strongly recommended that you print and/or save your child's reports to your computer as a PDF if you want to maintain access to it for future reference. LIBRARY BOOKS AND TEXTBOOKS

Please ensure all library books and textbooks are returned to the school before next Thursday. There are some with lost library book fines outstanding on School Cash. If you are unable to find the book, please submit payment through School Cash. If families find any "lost" books over the summer break, please bring them to school at the start of the new school year.

SPORTS JERSEYS

A reminder for any students who have not yet returned their sports jerseys for volleyball, basketball, ultimate or track, please return them (washed) by Monday.

WATER BOTTLES, HATS, SUNSCREEN

Summer weather is starting to arrive, and we are asking students to be prepared for the hotter weather. Please apply sunscreen before the school day and have your child bring a hat. Most importantly ensure your child has a filled water bottle.

RETURNING TO SCHOOL AFTER SUMMER BREAK

If you are extending the summer break and returning after we begin classes on Tuesday, September 3rd, please keep in mind [AP 300 Student Registration and Enrolment](#) states that the unconfirmed whereabouts of an absent registered student will be removed from the school register if the student has not returned by 3:00 pm on the Thursday after school opening (September 5th). We are experiencing

long wait lists due to enrolment pressure to hold seats this year and school and district operations and planning will take priority over travel plans. Please reach out to Mr. Zerbe if you need more information or would like to review your intentions.

MOVING? CHANGING SCHOOLS?

It is very important to inform us if you know your child(ren) will **NOT** be returning to Ridgeview in September for the 2024/25 school year. Please email Mrs. Lytle (slytle@wvschools.ca) as soon as possible as it is important for us to have accurate information regarding enrollment for the upcoming school year. GRADE 6 AND 7 BAND REGISTRATIONS IS OPEN FOR 2024-2025

Registration for elementary concert band is now open for the 2024-2025 school year. Band is an optional program offered to Grade 6 and 7 students where they learn an instrument to play as a group. When you are ready to register, go to the [District Elementary Band Program page](#).

STUDENT ABSENCES / LATE ARRIVALS

It is extremely important that student absences/late arrivals be reported to the school office prior to 8:40am by leaving a voice message on the **'Call Back' phone line at 604-981-1252** or by emailing Mrs. Lytle (slytle@wvschools.ca). Please call each day your child is absent or if you know your child will be away for an extended period of time (such as holidays), please email the office so that this information can be recorded on the Call Back 'long term' form. Thank you for your cooperation.

LUNCH UTENSILS – REMEMBER TO PACK FROM HOME

A reminder to pack a reusable fork, spoon or chopsticks from home should your child require a utensil to eat what they have for their lunch. This includes if they are receiving hot lunch. In order to reduce the amount of waste produced, **utensils are not provided with hot lunch and we do not have utensils available in the office.**

PERSONAL DIGITAL DEVICES

On January 26th, 2024, the Province announced three significant actions to enhance the safety and well-being of students in relation to digital technology, including the introduction of restrictions on the use of personal digital devices in schools (this would apply to cell phones, laptops, tablets, smartwatches, etc.). These updated policies will be in place for the 24-25 school year.

Most West Vancouver Schools already have technology guidelines in place. We recognize that the unregulated use of personal devices can be a significant distraction from learning. These devices can interrupt class time, interfere with student focus and disrupt the educational environment. However, we also understand that when used thoughtfully and with supervision, digital technology can offer valuable opportunities for our students. These tools can enhance the learning by enabling students to create content, communicate, collaborate and share.

Starting in September we will be refocussing our approach with personal digital device use in both elementary and secondary schools. In compliance with our technology guidelines, personal digital devices will only be used with the direct permission of the teacher and/or administrator, who will provide clear guidelines to ensure their use is intentional and purposeful in supporting student learning.

Additionally, considerations will be made to accommodate students' medical and health needs, accessibility, and accommodation requirements.

Personal digital device expectations will be in effect throughout the full school day, including before school, after school, and during break times.

More detailed information about these new expectations will be shared at the start of the 2024-25 school year. In September, we will ask parents and guardians to support these guidelines by minimizing calls and texts to their children during school hours. It is important for students to remain focused and engaged in their learning without the expectation of responding immediately to messages. We also encourage families to start thinking about how they can support these new expectations to ensure a smooth transition for everyone.

Thank you for your attention and cooperation as we work together to create a safe and productive learning environment for our students.

HOT LUNCH PROGRAM - IMPORTANT YEAR END INFORMATION

As we get closer to the end of the school year, we are reviewing accounts and cleaning up our reporting to ensure final fundraising amounts are reconciled and final vendor payments are made. MunchaLunch is used for both the Hot Lunch Program & Fundraisers, therefore it's important that everything is reconciled for the school year end.

If you have a **balance owing in your account**, you will be receiving reminders from the MunchaLunch system to pay your balance. **Please pay the balance in your account by Thursday, June 20th.**

If you currently have a credit in your account, you have until June 18th to use it towards hot lunch purchases. After June 18th we will be reviewing the final list of those with credit balances still showing on account.

For credits under \$10- these will be closed out of the system and included in the fundraising total. For credits over \$10- we will facilitate rolling over the credit to use in the next school year. If you are changing schools next year and have a credit over \$10 after June 18th, please email our Ridgeview Lunch email address at ridgeviewlunch@gmail.com.

MunchaLunch closes its ordering system down on June 30th and will not re-open again until the start of the new school year. If you need to download any receipts from this year, you must do so before this date. They WILL NOT be available after that date as the system re-sets and clears out all balances and previous orders to prepare for the new school year.
