During their competition, they were required to perform four different events; Story, Open, Theme, and Character. In each event, they were given a suggestion (provided by the audience) and a five second huddle to plan the following skit that they will act out on-stage with no prior preparation. Each event calls for different elements to be included in the scenes. For example, in Character the actors need to explore a character trait given to them by the crowd in as many ways as possible. They will portray these different sides of the trait in several scenes that they make up on the spot in front of hundreds of people. "I loved having the opportunity to be part of a team. We learned how to work with each other and predict each other's next actions. It was incredible to just jump into a scene where everyone instantly knows how it will play out," Kelk Jeffery says when asked about competing in the Canadian Improv Games.


2. Amsterdam, Netherlands






