Rene Descartes asked himself this question a few hundred years ago, and, after a long series of arguments in his <i>Meditations</i> , he concluded the only thing he could be certain of is, "I think, therefore I am." In other words, he concluded that he couldn't be sure of anything except for the fact that he existed. Many philosophers agreed that Descartes' arguments and conclusion were correct. Before Descartes, it was generally considered obvious that the world existed along with everyone and everything (and more), but after Descartes, people started to question whether the external world actually existed. Are all ideas subjective? What is objectivity? What are facts and truths? Is everything relative and therefore equally valid? Like Descartes, philosophers have thought that such questions could be answered by figuring out how the world exists, or the nature of existence itself. Among those philosophers who attempted to answer those questions, we will discuss Descartes, Kant, Hegel, and Nietzsche.	C203
