The School

Rockridge Secondary School is a coed public school founded in 1996 in the municipality of West Vancouver. Rockridge has a total enrollment of approximately 960 students in Grades 8 – 12. Graduating classes typically number approximately 200 students.

Rockridge Mission Statement

The School Calendar

Three terms over a 36-week school year:

Term 1: September - November Term 2: December - February Term 3: March - June

Students take formal school or provincial assessments in June. There are three official reporting periods: mid-December, March and late June. Almost all courses are of full-year duration. Classes meet five times in a two-week cycle.

IB Learner Profile

"The aim of the Middle Years Programme is to develop internationally minded people who, recognizing our common humanity and shared guardianship of the planet, help to create a better and more peaceful world."

The IB Learner Profile is an integral part of the IB curriculum. It consists of ten attributes that promote the development of internationallyminded, academically prepared citizens.

Service Learning

Students demonstrate empathy, compassion and respect in their quest to be service-oriented individuals. They act to make a positive difference in the lives of others and in their world. Grade 8 – 10 students are required to complete 5, 10 and 15 hours respectively.

Criterion-related Assessment

Student learning is assessed against criteria that has been developed by the International Baccalaureate Organization (IBO) and clarified with students. Throughout the year, criteria are shared with students and performance is assessed against the criteria.

Inquiry-based Learning

The MYP stimulates critical and creative thinking through inquirybased, student-centred education. Inquiry-based learning promotes curiosity and engages students.

Interdisciplinary Learning

Students engage in at least one collaboratively planned interdisciplinary unit that involves a minimum of two subject areas. These units support students to understand bodies of knowledge from varying disciplines in order to integrate them and create new understanding. Our changing world demands education that empowers people to integrate disciplines in novel and creative ways. For example, outdoor survival and safety knowledge and skills are developed in a Grade 9 interdisciplinary unit incorporating Foods 9, Math 9, English 9 and Physical Education 9.

Major Grade 10 Project

The MYP Personal Project is a student-centred practical exploration in which students consolidate their learning throughout the programme. It is an independent learning experience where students demonstrate the skills, attitudes and knowledge required to complete the project. The MYP Personal Project helps prepare students for their future studies and the workplace as they are constantly engaged in reflection in order to develop their own interests for lifelong learning.

BC Ministry of Education Graduation Requirements

Students must earn at least 80 course credits and complete the Provincial Graduation Assessments in Numeracy and Literacy in order to graduate. Of these 80 credits:

- At least 16 credits must be at the Grade 12 level, including a required Language Arts 12
- At least 28 credits must be elective course credits
- 52 credits are required from the following:
 - Career-Life Education (4 credits), and Career-Life Connections (4 credits)
 - Physical and Health Education 10 (4 credits)
 - Science 10 (4 credits), and a Science 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - Social Studies 10 (4 credits), and a Social Studies 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - A Math 10 (4 credits), and a Math 11 or 12 (4 credits)
 - A Language Arts 10, 11 and a required 12 (12 credits total)
 - An Arts Education 10, 11, or 12 and/or an Applied Design, Skills, and Technologies 10, 11, or 12 (4 credits total)

University Placements

Rockridge graduates attend university and post-secondary programs at a rate of 92% (within three years of graduation). This is considerably higher than the provincial rate. Rockridge graduates are well represented at universities and colleges in North America and internationally.
