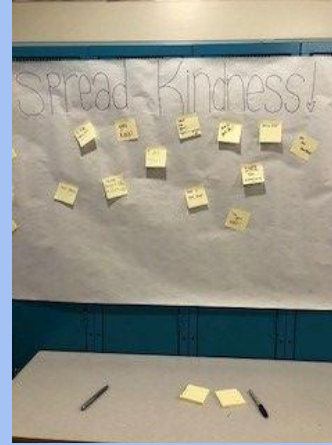

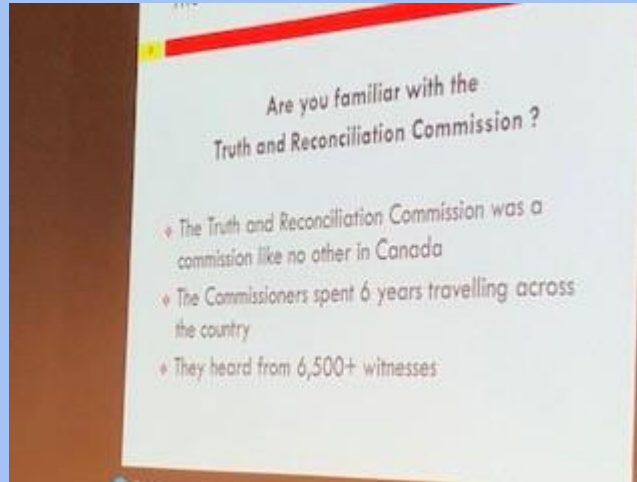

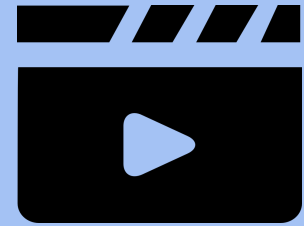

Assessment Thinking - Provincial Level

Tracy Smith is part of Ministry Gr. 6-12 Proficiency Project Development Team and Jennifer Towers is part of a Metro working group looking at shifts in assessment.

What's the latest thinking on assessment?

- Use of more competency-based assessment practices and consistent language
- Focus on growth as opposed to letter grades and percentages
- Student's final summative piece is one part of the learning journey; process is important
- Look at students through a 'triangulation of competencies'; give them multiple ways to show their learning
- Ask student, "How can we work within your skill set to show you know this?"
- Create learning stories, pathways

Assessment conversations are happening at Rockridge...and it's exciting!



Graduation Assessments

Completed this school year:

- Graduation Literacy Assessment 10 (GLA 10) administered to Gr. 11s (November, 2020) - due to suspension of in-person classes last spring
- GLA 10 for Gr. 10s (January, 2021)
- Graduation Numeracy Assessment 10 (GNA 10) for Gr. 10s (April, 2021)
- GNA 10 and GLA 10 re-writes scheduled for June 16th and June 22nd, 2021

Next year:

- In addition to GLA 10 and GNA 10, GLA 12 will be administered

Students have up to 3 opportunities to write an assessment; best result recorded

Graduation Literacy Assessment (GLA) 10

Structure:

- Reflects the new curriculum
- Involves complex thinking and analysis skills
- Asks students to comprehend and critically analyze a variety of reading materials, communicate understanding and make personal connections
- Tasks selected from a broad range of curricular areas

Assessment - 4-point proficiency scale

- 1 Emerging
- 2 Developing
- 3 Proficient
- 4 Extending



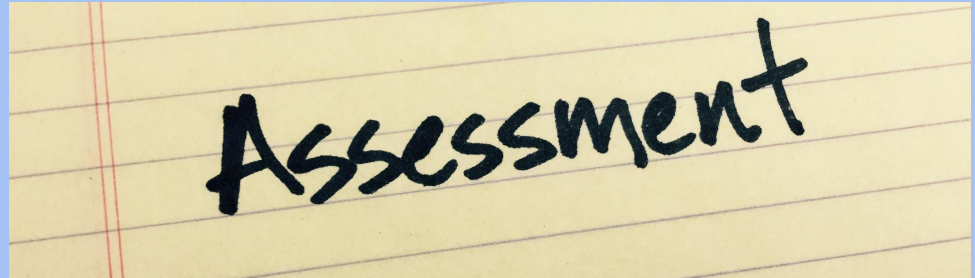
Graduation Literacy Assessment - How are we doing?

Gr. 11s (November 2020)

- 68% scored '3'
- 22% scored '4'

Gr. 10s (January 2021)

- 63% scored '3'
- 25% scored '4'



We follow up with students scoring a 1 (emerging) or a 2 (developing)

The mean score of Rockridge is 6% higher on comprehension tasks and 10% higher on communication tasks than the mean result of all BC public schools

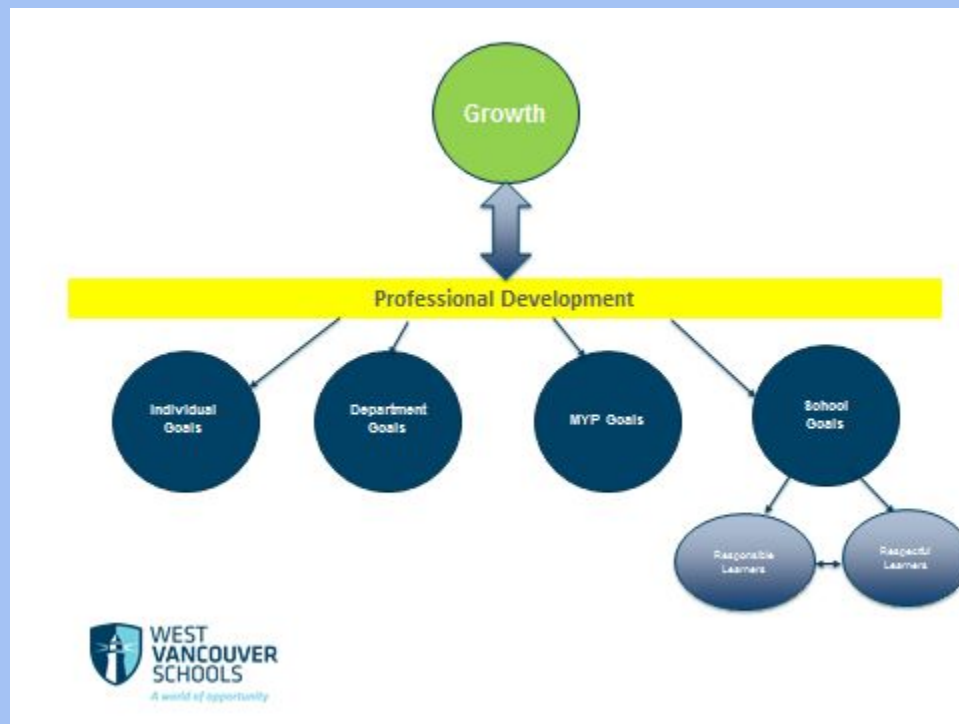
