Chair's Report: 5:35 pm

- Teresa Corey provided a report. \$2500 has been spent out of gaming account and \$2000 out of general account.
- General account stands at \$12,992.

DPAC Report:

Helen Hall provided the DPAC update, on behalf of Kelly Richter:

- Every year, DPAC has asked input from parents regarding funding (i.e./increased bus service, more EA's in school, etc.)
- Kelly Richter reported that the District has asked for input on budget; where is the district money going to be spent? There needs to be a discussion about what needs support?

Outdoor Classroom:

Lisa Mingo provided an update:

- District has given general "ok " to design. Still waiting to hear back from district on rough estimate for tensile structure: \$50,000 (tenting, posts, foundation) doesn't include the seating and the concrete patio. Next steps are with Mr. Henning. \$50,000 (engineering, steel posts and installation); doesn't include concrete platfrom and seating area relying on volunteers to do that.
- Further update: Needs to get ok from higher level (distance between existing building and the new structure). Once that is done, the architects will submit the plans.
- If the District comes back that fire regulations are compliant, then the next step involves a more refined cost estimate, and submitting the building permit (approximately 4 months). However, it may take longer to process the building permit.

Spring Fling:

Sara Relling / Kim Gould provided an update:

- 30 tickets sold / goal is to have 150 people attend
- Agreed that the group would send notification out to networks (email to our friends / contacts)
- Agreed that we need to print posters (Generating QR code to which people can link directly).
- Standalone email to the parent population:
- Grade 8 & 9: opportunity to meet parents (suggestion to host pre-parties)
- PAC Chairs: Caulfeild, Gleneagles (Kelly) West Bay (Sylvia) will be volunteering to supervise.
- Guests will wear a sticker with their kids's name and grade.

Scholarship Committee:

Helen Hall provided an update on scholarship trust.

- Scholarship Committee is: Tracy Rowbottam, Shayle Duffield, Graham Jackson, Helen Hall: All
 the money collected is held in trust for the school district. PAC raises this money. GJ works with
 the Grade 12 teachers to determine who will be awarded. 50 scholarships: \$250 \$500 (some
 are up to \$1000).
- \$94,000 in funds (\$50,000 of that is in trust, use the interest that it earned and use this for scholarships we may break the trust on that and just use the money, due to reduced interest).

• \$15,000 is required to fund the scholarships for this year; going forward, we will need to put some money into this fund to replenish.
