A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Midterm Reports will be posted for students and parents/guardians to review today. This includes MYP reports, non-MYP reports as well as updated Individual Education Plans for students with IEPs. With that in mind, today, or over the weekend, please take time to review your Rockridge scholar's report together.

If you or your student have questions about any marks or comments, please encourage students to speak to their teacher. Parents/guardians may wish to contact teachers directly too if you are unclear about any report content. Our aim is that these reports are not surprising, but informative and a mid semester snapshot of how your scholar is progressing so far this semester. For new families to Rockridge, especially those in Grade 8-10, please be sure to pause and read the school message on the first page of the report. This provides you with helpful information about MYP assessment and the numerical values you will see for each subject area. The teacher comments will provide further clarification about each student's progress with regard to their strengths and stretches. This midpoint in the first semester is the perfect time for students to draw on their MYP learner profile traits of being *reflective* and *open-minded* and *communicate* goals for the second half of the semester.

Students are always at the centre of our work and learning at Rockridge, and sometimes our work happens even when students are not in the building. On Monday, Rockridge staff engaged in a school-

based Professional Development Day. Families probably wonder what these days look like - in short, it was a collaborative day where all our staff engaged in Professional Learning Networks and helped to further develop our three year school goal plan (FESL). An important and inspiring detail to note about our Rockridge staff is how dedicated they are to improving their own practice and leading others to grow in new and effective ways to support student learning.

In upcoming E-Bulletins I will share more about our FESL (Framework for Enhancing Student Learning) and how our school goal will support student learning and our Rockridge community. Another piece to look for is parent input and feedback as this is an important part of our FESL three year journey.

DISTRICT AFFORDABILITY FUND

The Ministry of Education has provided West Vancouver Schools \$650,000, a one-time funding grant for us to make the 22/23 school year more affordable for students and families in need. We have now received the funding for our 18 schools and have allocated the money based on the specific needs of each of our school communities. Our allocation:

- Will allow schools to cover costs for school fees, school supplies or other school related costs for students in need
- Some funds will be used to benefit large groups of both elementary and secondary students

Families are encouraged to reach out to their principal if any financial support is needed for schoolbased supplies, fees or activities.

BLOCK 5 UPDATES THIS WEEK

Our Tuesday and Thursday schedule provides ongoing opportunities for students to use their time to focus on the individualized learning they need.

RECURRING ITEMS

SchoolCash Online - Student Fees

Rockridge uses School Cash Online for school items requiring payment. This system is utilized throughout the West Vancouver School District, and you and your child will continue to receive payment requests in this manner. If you are new to the WV School District and have not yet registered for SchoolCash Online, we can provide you with a temporary PIN number to be used the first time you log in, then you will be prompted to create a login and password for future access. Please email rockridge@wvschools.ca with your student's name and grade to request this PIN if you are not yet set up with an account.

Excused Absences and Early Dismissals

If a student will be late for school or missing a block, parents are requested to inform the school by sending an email to rockridge@wvschools.ca . Please include the student's full legal name and grade, time of Absence and Reason for Absence. Students arriving 'late' for class should proceed directly to

their class and check in with the teacher who will modify the attendance to indicate 'late' rather than 'absent'.

This online verification and consent form requires a parent login and must be completed for all students each year. If a parent previously created an account to complete the 21/22 form, the account is the same. If you have forgotten your password, you can follow the instructions to reset it. Once logged in, parents have the option to either update a P+P form created last year or start a new one.

Please be aware that a new P+P consent form MUST be completed for each student, each school year. Without a completed consent form, students are not permitted to access their Google classrooms, have their photos included in the yearbook etc. Permissions expire on August 31 each year.

Student Verification & Emergency Release Forms

These forms were sent home with your child at the beginning of the school year. Please return as soon as possible so that we can complete our Emergency Preparedness Plan.

Student Drop Off and Pick Up

A reminder to all parents regarding the student drop-off procedures before and after school. Your cooperation will ensure a safe and efficient process, allowing emergency vehicles access to our building at all times. Walking to school is a great alternative for students, to avoid traffic congestion and added stress. Thank you in advance! Please be aware of the following:

- All numbered spots in both the front and back parking lots are staff designated at all times; many of our staff work at multiple sites and need spots left open for their return. Please do not park in a numbered spot at any time.
- Visitor spaces at the front of school are not to be used from 7:30am to 9:00 am and 2:30pm to 3:30pm. If you need to park, during these times, please use the Upper North Lot or street parking.
- Please do not block the driveway at any time and do not stop in the circle directly in front of the main entrance.
- Student drivers are permitted to park in the North Lot only; all student drivers must purchase a Rockridge Parking Decal from the office and display it on their windshield, as periodic monitoring will be done.
- Carpooling or drop off locations outside of school property will alleviate congestion for all.

It is recommended that parents pull forward and pick up their child adjacent to the field whenever possible or in the North Lot. We appreciate your cooperation to help ensure the front of the school is kept clear and traffic flows efficiently.

Health & Safety

We want to ensure all our families know that the wellness of our Rockridge community is always top of mind. There are three simple reminders we continue to share with staff, students and caregivers:

- 1. Hand hygiene is an effective means to prevent illness.
- 2. Wearing a mask is always an option for members of our school community.
- 3. If you are not well, stay home, rest and return when you are better. Students can use Google Classroom, contact their teacher or classmates to keep up with assignments.
