A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

Well, that was fast . . . this four day week has flown by and we are set up for another one following this Thanksgiving long weekend. It has been a busy week beyond the great learning opportunities including many Ravens athletic team contests and a special celebration of World Teachers' Day here at the Rock.

A brief reflection on our schedules, staff collaboration and student learning opportunities . . .

A great example of the connection between our work as a staff and the impact on student learning came together today in our FIT - Flexible Instruction Time. Last Thursday, during our Collaboration Time, our teachers worked together in the library learning commons reviewing a lesson plan for goal setting and reflection of our ATLs (Approaches to Learning) – specifically self-management and social skills.

In each of our three learning terms this year, students will be self-reflecting on different areas of their learning skills and abilities from our ATLs. Today in FIT, all students in Gr. 8 to 12 were to complete the first part of their goal setting assignment to be able to self-reflect at the end of the term in November.

It was nice to see the unique Collaboration Schedule and FIT Schedule come together today to support communication of student learning. To learn more about this student reporting activity, just ask your child to open their Grad Class Google Classroom to show you the document posted by Mr. Baker this morning. As an aside, if students did not complete this assignment and submit it today, they should do so by the end of next week.

HONOUR ROLL and MIDDLE YEARS PROGRAM CERTIFICATES for 2022-23

Our Rockridge students will be recognized for their achievements in the 2023-23 academic year via Honour Roll, Academic Distinction, and MYP Certificates, to be distributed along with student cards at a special homeroom on Tuesday, October 10th from 8:30 - 845 AM. Now that we are back on the linear schedule we will be able to recognize the 2023-2024 academic honours achievements of our students along with all of our regular awards at the end of June.

ROCKRIDGE AWARDED 2023 ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) SCHOOL HONOR ROLL

Rockridge was named to the AP School Honor Roll for the 2022-23 school year. The AP School Honor Roll recognizes schools whose AP programs are delivering results and broadening access for students. Congratulations to our AP students and teachers!

Rockridge earned this recognition based on our ability to increase students' university readiness, to improve university-going culture, and to provide opportunities for students to earn college credit.

Rockridge had 64% of graduates write at least one AP exam during high school. We earned Gold status by having 36% of students earn greater than 3 on their AP exam. Research indicates students who score 3 or higher on these exams enjoy greater success in their post-secondary studies.

Rockridge Advanced Placement Coordinator Mr. Garth Thomson commented, "Rockridge is proud of the many learning opportunities we create for our students. With 12 different courses encompassing several areas of study, our AP program offers challenging curricula focused on developing critical thinking, analysis, collaboration, and meaningful exam preparation. We are grateful to our dedicated faculty who work tirelessly to receive training, to prepare and deliver engaging course work and to our students who enthusiastically engage in the work"

This week's MYP Moment...

Did you know that the wider BC Ministry Education has put in place new requirements for students to regularly set goals and reflect on their core competencies throughout the year for grades K-12? And did you know that these core competencies match quite well the Approaches to Learning (ATLs) from MYP? (Lots of public education governing bodies like to borrow from the International Baccalaureate programs!)

ATLs are all about 'learning how to learn'. They are meant to be skills that learners carry with them throughout their lives. The first two ATLs/competency students will set goals for (and later reflect on) are Social Skills and Self-Management. This is a set of abilities that relate to a student's identity in the world, both as individuals and as members of their community and society. The Social & Self-Management competency encompasses what students need to thrive as individuals, to understand and care about themselves and others, and to find and achieve their purposes in the world. As they contemplate and set goals for themselves, they might choose to set goals within a school context, or they might set goals that are bigger and more holistic to their everyday living. The scope with which they set their goals will vary from student to student. It's where they recognize room for growth underneath the Social & Self-Management umbrella.

How can you participate?

You can ask them what goals they set for themselves to be completed over the next couple of months. Listen to what they say and ask them how you can be supportive! It takes an open, encouraging, safe community to help push us into new realms and skills. So, keep being there for your students!

This online verification and consent form requires a parent login and must be submitted for each student at the start of each school year. We ask that it is submitted ONLY ONCE PER STUDENT, as the upload gets very onerous with multiple submissions. Again, we are only at **60%** and we need to be at **100%**. For later changes, please inform the office.

- If you previously created an account to complete the 22/23 form, the account is the same.
- If you have forgotten your password, you can follow the instructions to reset it.

- Once logged in, you will have the option to either update a P+P form created last year or start a new one.
- Without a completed consent form, students will not be permitted to attend field trips, join school teams or have their photos included in the yearbook. Permissions expire on August 31 each year.

Language CHALLENGE EXAMS

- 1. The deadline for applications to the 2023/2024 Language Challenge Exams is **November 3, 2023**.
- 2. Exams will take place on Saturday, **January 27th** and Sunday, **January 28th**, 2024. Your exam will take around three hours you will be informed whether your exam is scheduled for the morning or afternoon.
- 3. In the Challenge Exam Application Package, Page 9 is to be filled out online before you print the package. You will see the highlighted areas and drop boxes where you should type.
- 4. Confirmation emails will be sent out by **December 15, 2023**. If you have not received an email confirmation letter after that date, please contact us by email (**pmanuel@deltaschools.ca**) or call 604-940-5550.
- 5. All universities in Canada accept Language Challenge exam marks. UBC accepts Challenge credits for pre-requisite requirements for courses and second-language requirements but does not accept Challenge marks as part of the GPA calculation for admission. It is highly recommended that you check with your intended university for their admissions requirements.

Provincial Reporting Policy

As communicated last Spring, the Ministry of Education and Child Care has implemented a new Learning Update Policy which defines and provides direction for the ways our school will be communicating your child's learning. The goal of the Learning Updates is to provide personalized, descriptive feedback to effectively communicate with students, parents, and caregivers about where students are in their learning, next steps, and how families and teachers can work together to support student growth. The provincial Reporting Policy mandates that students in Kindergarten through Grade 9 will be assessed using the four-point proficiency scale and students in Grade 10 through Grade 12 courses will be assessed using letter grades and percentages. Each term, students at all levels will be sharing self-reflections and making goals around British Columbia's Core Competencies – Communication Skills, Thinking Skills, and Personal and Social Skills.

Teachers will be communicating and reporting throughout the year in the following formats:

· 3 Formal Written Learning Updates (2 Mid-year Learning Updates, and 1 Summary of Learning)

· 2 Informal Learning Updates (ex. Parent-Teacher Conferences, Student-Family-Teacher Conference, Interim Report)

The Ministry of Education and Child Care, responsible for creating reporting requirements, has provided reporting information for parents and caregivers in the following languages: English, French, Chinese (Simplified and Traditional, Tagalog, Farsi, Urdu, Punjabi Gurmukhi
